Ordinance 3-2007 Enterprise Fund Budget: Proposed Water & Sewer Rate Increase An ordinance increasing the basic water rate from \$16.40 to \$20.40 and the basic sewer rate from \$24.60 to \$30.60, after two public hearings, was approved. It was agreed that the council would review the rate structure currently, to determined fixed cost and non-fixed cost and appropriate split between basic rates and additional usage rates.

<u>Ordinance 4-2007 2007-2008 Budget</u> An ordinance proposing the 2007-2008 Budget, including setting the tax rate at \$.30 per \$100 assessed value for real property (no change from previous year) and an Enterprise budget, after public hearing, was approved.

<u>Lakeside Development Update</u> The attorney for the developer of this project reported to the Planning Commission that they have completed settlement on almost all sites comprising the property. All hearings have been held and the developer anticipates receiving necessary permits in the near future.

Please be aware of the speed limits within the Town. All streets and roads are 25 MPH except:

Main Street from approximately Home Run Baker Park to Old Trappe Rd. and White Marsh Rd., the limit is 35 MPH; Old Trappe Rd. is 45 MPH; White Marsh Rd. is 50 MPH; Howell Point Rd. is 35 MPH; Barber Rd. from Rt. 50 past the curve at Marvel Drive is 35 MPH, then it becomes 50 MPH to Paradise Cemetary; and Rt. 50 is 55 MPH.



In June 2006, the Surgeon General's report confirmed that there is no safe level of exposure to secondhand smoke.

Children exposed to secondhand smoke have significantly more incidents of bronchitis, earaches, colds, flu, childhood leukemia and SIDS.

HURRICANE STORM SEASON IS APPROACHING

Suggested precautions include:

- storing 3-6 days worth of canned or nonperishable food
- storing at least 3 gallon jugs of water
- pre-assembling a Disaster Supplies Kit (for more information,

 $visit\ www.fema.gov/areyouready/assemble_disaster_supplies_kit.shtm)$

In the event of an impending hurricane, Phase II would involve voluntary evacuation, particularly of the most vulnerable people, such as the very young, ill, or elderly residents via bus or ambulance. Talbot County recently instituted a Reverse 911 system, which allows emergency information to be conveyed to large numbers of households via an automated telephone messaging system. Because of our geographic location and the number of vehicles generated by summer beach traffic, an evacuation would probably result in a bottleneck of traffic trying to cross the Bay Bridge. Counties along U.S. Route 50 are particularly urged to have an emergency plan in place.

In case of a Hurricane Emergency...

Citizens can contact the **Talbot County Emergency Management Agency** at **410-770-6860** for additional information.

NOTE: Citizens with special needs should contact the Talbot County Emergency Management Agency at 410-822-0095 for additional information.

WCEI Radio Station (Easton 96.7 FM or 1460 AM) will broadcast any emergency advisory or evacuation information.

During Phase III, anyone refusing to evacuate must sign a waiver that they have been advised of the risk involved. Evacuees will take shelter and universal radio frequencies will be used for emergency communications. The primary shelter for Talbot County is at Easton High School. In the event of an evacuation, residents should NOT attempt to drive their personal vehicle to the shelter, but wait for information about central collecting points, from which busses will make transport to the high school. A Pet Shelter will be available at the high school, manned by the Talbot County Humane Society. Anyone wishes to bring their pet to the shelter must remain at the shelter and provide a pet carrier and 3 days worth of food for their pet. Phase IV of the plan involves recovery and assessment and debris removal.

A copy of the Talbot County Emergency Management Operations Plan is available for your review at the library located in Easton and also at the branch office in St. Michaels.

Scotts United Methodist Church was recently awarded the "Community Excellence Award" for minority achievement by the Maryland State Department of Education and the Achievement Initiative for Maryland's Minority Students (AIMMS). This award is presented to those who make outstanding contributions to equity in education for all students. The tutorial program at Scotts United Methodist Church has been providing community-based academic support services for at-risk youth in grades 4 to 12 since 2003. While the program primarily targets minority students, other students in the community are also welcome to participate. Services provided to students by adults include: homework assistance, one-to-one tutoring, character development (through the Character Counts! program) and goal setting. The program operates four days a week for 2 hours after school. On most days, a minimum of 25 students participate. A computer learning center and a reading center are just some of the resources available to students during the program. Parents of the students are encouraged to volunteer and make a commitment to monitor their student's progress in the program, as well as in the classroom. The program is supported by Talbot Family Network, which has renewed the grant every year since its inception due to the program's outstanding achievement.

FUN FOOD FACTS:

A woman named Cecil Steel, of Ocean View, Delaware accidentally started the state's huge **chicken** industry in 1923. Instead of receiving the 50 chicks she had ordered to provide eggs and meat for her



family, she received 500 chicks. She kept them, and decided to butcher and market these chickens when they were 16 weeks old, which was considered early at that time. She called her chickens "broilers" because they could be cooked quickly. Within 10 years, the broiler industry (broilers are now defined as chickens between 9

& 12 weeks of age) was firmly established in Delaware.



A popular PA Dutch food is shoofly pie. **Shoofly pie** is made by turning a crumb-cake mixture sweetened with molasses into a pie shell and baking it. It got its name because supposedly you had to shoo the flies away while it was cooling.
