MAY 2011 ELECTION INFORMATION

The City of Taneytown will hold its City Election on Monday, May 2nd, 2011 between the hours of 7:00 AM and 7:00PM at the Taneytown Police Department, located at 120 E. Baltimore Street. The election is for Mayor (4-year term) and two full-term (4-year) Councilmember seats.

Any resident of Taneytown seeking election to these offices must file a Certification of Nomination no later than 4:00PM on Monday, April 4, 2011. Certificates of Nomination may be obtained from the office of the City of Taneytown, located at 17 E. Baltimore Street, Taneytown during regular business hours.

Candidates shall be at least 25 years of age, shall have resided in the City of Taneytown for at least five years for Mayor and at least two years for Councilmember and be a qualified voter of the City. All persons who file the appropriate Certificate of Nomination shall be considered nominees for the office set forth in the Certificate and their names shall appear on the ballot at the General Election.

Residents of the City of Taneytown who are at least 18 years of age and registered with the Carroll County Board of Elections shall be a qualified voter of the City. Residents must be registered to vote at the Carroll County Board of Elections no later than 4:00 PM, Friday April 2, 2011. If you are registered to vote in a Federal, State or County Election you do not need to register again.

Absentee ballots may be obtained from the City Office after completing a request form and shall be available on April 11, 2011. All completed absentee ballots must be returned no later than 7P.M. May 2, 2011. The request form for Absentee Ballots is available by contacting the City Office or from the City's website.

WATER BILLS

The water bills will be sent out on April 1st. Payment is due by April 29th at 4:30 PM. If not paid by the due date, you will receive a pink notice in the mail May 2nd. This notice will include the 10% penalty to the unpaid bill. The second notice bill will be due on May 16th. Any water/sewer payment not paid will be turned off starting May 17th. There is a re-connect fee of \$50.00.



PUBLIC WORKS DEPARTMENT

YARD WASTE

The Public Works Department will again pick up grass clippings on Tuesdays. You must call the City Office before 3 p.m. on Monday to schedule for pick up. Please place your bags at the curb by 7:30 a.m. Grass clippings must be placed in paper or kraft bags only. Please limit the weight of bags so they can easily be lifted for loading and unloading without bag breakage. This service is limited to grass clippings only. Please do not dispose of dirt, sod, thistle, or household garbage. Currently there are no charges to Carroll County residents for disposal of yard waste, at the Carroll County Landfill in Westminster (410) 386-4550.

STORM WATER DRAINAGE **INLETS**

Please do not sweep or blow grass and debris into the street. This practice can block downstream storm water inlet grates causing storm water to backup into the street, creating flooding conditions.

Also, please report anyone seen dumping materials into the storm water drainage system, by contacting the Taneytown Police Department (410-751-1150) or the City Office (410-751-1100). It could be contaminating our environment.

BULK TRASH

Saturday, May 14, 2011: From 7 a.m. to 1 p.m., the City will provide compaction trucks and dumpsters at Taneytown Memorial Park for the removal of bulk trash. Citizens are asked to observe the following procedures:

- Citizens will be responsible for bringing their trash to the park for dis-
- All persons who are dumping material will be required to show proper ID

to the attendants, before they can drop off their items. Only citizens of Taneytown will be allowed to dispose of trash. All others will be turned away.

- Please do not leave trash in the park after hours specified above. The trash disposal service will only operate during these hours.
- Vehicles transporting bulk trash for disposal must be limited to passenger vehicles and pickup trucks. Larger trucks should haul their items directly to the Carroll County Landfill.
- All items containing oil and/or gas must be drained.
- The attendant will direct you to dedicated dumpsters for metal items and appliances only.
- There will be one compaction truck designated for all other acceptable recyclable items, which includes little tyke play equipment, plastic trash cans, etc.
- To keep the flow of traffic moving, all recycling items should be separated before entering the drop-off area.
- Dirt, sod, yard waste, tires, propane tanks, batteries, paint, or chemicals of any type, will not be accepted.

This will be the only bulk trash event for 2011, so please have your unwanted items ready for disposal this spring.

Due to the Memorial Day Holiday, collection will take place on Thursday, June 2, 2011 instead of Wednesday, June 1, 2011.

project completed well before then. Our target date for completion is still sometime in June. We are about 90% finished. All we have left is really the down town with curbing and traffic signals to be installed at Trevanion and E. Baltimore St and Baumgardner and E. Baltimore St. Again I want to thank everyone for their patience and understanding during this project. This was the biggest Streetscape project ever taken on by the Maryland State Highway Department. While they have the authority to "call the shots" during the construction, they have been very responsive to citizen requests. Please keep your comments coming!

In addition to the "Big Shindig" to be held in September, there are a couple of other big events coming right up. On May 21st we will hold our annual "Swing Into Spring" event. This year's event will be bigger and better then ever. Thanks to Cynthia Lamirande and her committee for all the work it took to put this together. I have enjoyed my term as your Mayor for these past four years and have been proud of what we have been able to accomplish. SANITARY SEWERS

The City of Taneytown makes every effort to be responsive to a resident's needs and concerns when a sewer backup occurs. As with many other municipalities, the City cannot assume responsibility for sewerage and water damage caused by sewer backups. The City routinely cleans and televises sewer mains. Unfortunately, because a sewer is not a closed secured system, many things put into the sewer can clog the system. Factors that can cause backups are: grease, disposable diapers, tree roots, and other foreign items disposed of through the sewer system. These items should be discarded in your household garbage.

stroyed a large portion of this country. You may not be aware, but Taneytown has a special connection with this part of Japan. Back in May of 2005 a delegation from Sendai Miyagi, representing the Urban Renewal Commission of Japan, visited our City to view what we have accomplished as part of the National Main Street program. Our visitors were shown around the downtown and toured City Hall. We then gathered for lunch at Antrim 1844 Inn, where discussions continued regarding our success in the National Main street program. During this occasion, then Mayor Robert Flickinger proclaimed Sendai Miyagi a "Sister City". Sendai Miyagi took a direct hit from the tsunami and much of the city was destroyed. 

URBAN RENEWAL COMMISSION FROM JAPAN STUDIES TANEYTOWN'S URBAN SUCCESSES

From the Spring 2005 issue of the Taneytown Record, written by Patricia A. Bianca

On May 5, 2005, Taneytown was visited by several members of the Urban Renewal Coordinator Association of Japan (URCA) from Taneytown's sister city of Sendi Mayaki, who toured the town and spoke to several of our Main Street and City Officials about Taneytown's own urban renewal projects.

The group consisted of an architect, a construction specialist, several urban planners and their interpreter, all of whom were in Maryland for the National Main Streets Conference, which was held in Baltimore May 8 through 11, 2005.

Representing Taneytown at the meeting were Taneytown Main Street Board Members and Officers John Myers, Nancy McCormick, Chris Ruppert and Jim Weiprecht, Zoning & Code Enforcement Director Aaron Valentino, Mayor Robert Flickinger, Carroll County Office of Tourism Director Barbara Beverungen, local entrepreneur Gail Wilson, local historians Helen Gorman and Tyler Boone, Mayor Pro Tem Jim McCarron, Police Chief William Tyler and local artist Roland Coney. Kevin Baines and Glenda Odman of the Maryland State Main Street program were also on hand.

URCA Managing Director Keiji Sato indicated that the group was particularly interested in Taneytown because it has been recognized as being particularly successful in its renewal efforts. He and his group hoped to bring several such success stories back home with them to Japan.

After the presentation of gifts, introductions and initial discussions about the genesis of Taneytown's Main Street program, its implementation and future planning issues, Taneytown Main Street Chairman Jim Weiprecht outlined some

These successes include the reduction in turnover of businesses downtown, the increased amount of foot traffic, the large amount of Main Street program volunteers (40) and the new openness and strong sense of community that is now prevalent in the downtown area as compared to pre-Main Street days.

Taneytown's Main Street Treasurer Chris Ruppert then fielded questions regarding budget issues and the success of fundraising projects such as our annual dance and the ad revenue generated by The Taneytown Record, both of which impressed the visitors very much.

The commission was also impressed with the artwork of local artist Roland Cooney, who was on-hand with his handmade sculptures of Japanese Anime characters, and with the architecture and the businesses they encountered on their brief tour of Taneytown's downtown area, which was hosted by Helen Gorman of the Taneytown Heritage Committee.
