I suspect that has never happened before. The good news is that the Cheverly Police and Public Works Departments once again performed admirably during these events. Special thanks to them for all the work they do to keep our Town running.

Green Infrastructure Plan: The Town Council unanimously passed a resolution adopting the Green Infrastructure Plan during their September 8th meeting. As a first step in adopting the recommendations of the Green Plan, the Council will consider a resolution to join the Baltimore Washington Partners for Forest Stewardship at the September 22nd meeting. The BWPFS is an organization consisting of Fort Meade, Maryland Dept of Natural Resources, Beltsville Agricultural Center and others for the express purpose of preserving our natural areas.

We also look forward to a kick-off of the Green Infrastructure Plan in tandem with the November 19th Community Market. While the kick-off is not yet finalized we hope to have demonstrations highlighting how residents can help make the Green Infrastructure Plan come to life. We will have Shred-It in the Community Center parking lot from 9 to noon to shred your cancelled checks, tax returns and other documents on site. Limit 3 boxes per household. All will be recycled to make new paper products.

New Speed Cameras require minor Parking

Code changes: As discussed in the September Newsletter the town has changed its speed camera vendor and the equipment has changed as well. Gone are the familiar skeleton arms that were seen near Legion Park, now we have the small silver boxes that I'm sure you've all seen. Since these boxes are lower to the ground the Town Council is considering changes to the Town Code that will allow the Town Administrator to declare temporary no parking zones for up to 150 days. The Town Administrator already has this authority for up to 30 days.

Odds and Ends: This month seems a little slow regarding neighborhood news, so here are some brief updates and shout outs on items of interest:

Aldi Opening: Aldi recently announced it was moving its opening date back to November 17th. Apparently they encountered 15 extra inches of concrete in the floor of the old Giant building causing the construction delay.

Garden Club: Thanks for the donation of the new bench in Town Park. Cheverly is very lucky to have such an active organization here in town.

Road Projects: Plans continue for the repaving of Belleview Avenue (3200 block thru 3600 block) and 63rd Ave from 3100 block to 3400 block. We hope for the conclusion of these efforts in October.

Community Yard Sale: A special Thank You goes to Patty King who organized a community yard sale on September 17th. Patty worked with the Public Works Department to close Greenleaf Ave from Forest Ave to Crest Ave so that residents could use the island to hold a giant yard sale.

58th Place Homes: There are three abandoned homes on 58th Place, bordering the B-W Parkway, that are owned by the National Park Service. Cheverly has been working with NPS for over 2 years to have the homes removed. We were recently informed that the NPS is working through the final stages of the process to have the homes removed. Unfortunately, as of yet there is no expected date for completion.

C-PACT/CHEVERLY WATCH RESIDENT RADIO PROGRAM MEETING – There will be a joint meeting of C-PACT (Cheverly – Citi-

zens and Police Together), Cheverly's Neighborhood Watch Organization, and the Cheverly Watch Resident Radio Program on Wednesday, October 12, 2011, at 7:00 PM, in the Police Department Conference Room.

UNIFORM CRIME REPORTING (UCR) DATA IS OUT FOR 2010 - The State of Maryland just released UCR data for crime in Maryland for 2010. Overall, crime dropped approximately 5% across the State with a specific decrease in violent crime of 6%. This reduction in crime was also observed in Prince George's County, where reported crimes dropped 3.8%. In an extension of this good news, the Town of Cheverly also enjoyed a 5.4% reduction in its crime rate. This reduction highlights a 5 year downward spiral in reported crime in Cheverly. Of the 27 municipalities in Prince George's County, in addition to crimes reported at the University of Maryland, Cheverly had the 5th lowest crime rate (victims per 100,000 population). The lowest was reported in Eagle Harbor, a very small town on the Southern tip of the County along the Patuxent River, with 1 criminal incident (a B&E).

ACCIDENT DATA FOR 2010 – Drivers in Prince George's County (13,013 accidents) experienced the 2nd highest accident total for the State of Maryland behind Baltimore City (19,060 accidents). Of these accidents, approximately 1/3 resulted in personal injury and the County led the State in the number of fatalities (92). In addition, the County had the 3rd highest total of pedestrian accidents behind Montgomery and Baltimore Counties respectively. All told, there were 90,517 traffic accidents in Maryland in 2010 that resulted in the deaths of 496 persons.

NEW PRESCRIPTION DROP BOX AT THE

STATION – The Department recently obtained a grant from the National Association of Drug Diversion Investigators (NADDI) for a prescription drug drop off box that is now located in the station lobby. All Cheverly residents are encouraged to drop off their expired prescription drugs for free disposal rather than depositing these items in regular trash or flushing unwanted drugs down a toilet. Not only does this service improve our environment, it deters unwanted narcotics and other drugs from falling into the hands of persons for which these drugs were not prescribed. Residents who wish to drop off expired prescription drugs, unused pharmaceuticals, or over the counter medications, may do so anonymously (no requests for identification will be made) during office hours (M-F, 9:00 AM to 5:00 PM) in the metal drop off box. Please make sure that any personal information (name, address, etc.) is

blocked out on any prescription container and that the lids on all liquids are tightly closed. No intra-venous solutions, injectibles, syringes, or illicit substances will be accepted. The next major pick up date by our destruction contractor is October 29, 2011.

<u>PROCEDURES</u>



Vacuum Leaves: Every street in Cheverly is scheduled for at least 2 vacuuming sweeps.

Rake leaves between the curb and sidewalk - not on the street or sidewalk.

- Keep leaves free of twigs, branches, metal, concrete and other debris that can jam or damage the equipment.
- Please do not park cars on the street on the assigned collection day.
- ONLY PUT LEAVES AT CURB 1 DAY PRIOR TO YOUR VACUUM DATE. Consider your neighbors when the wind blows your leaves into their freshly raked yard.

Bag Leaves: Yard waste is collected on **MONDAYS**. Put bags at the curb on Sunday evening.

Use <u>CLEAR PLASTIC BAGS</u> (sold at Town Hall or Public Works \$5 for 50 bags). Yard waste includes leaves, grass, brush, twigs, etc. Do not put any dirt, rocks, or other trash/debris in these bags.
