REMARKS

A notice of the Request For Proposals (RFP) was posted on DGS's Web Site, Bid Board and at eMarylandMarketplace.com (eMM) on 8/1/2011. Four hundred and eighty seven (487) vendors were contacted through eMM for this solicitation. Fourteen (14) firms submitted technical proposals. MBE Participation goals will be established on a project by project basis.

The Evaluation Committee convened on 9/22/2011 through 4/27/2012 to evaluate the technical proposals. Criteria considered in the evaluation process included: general competence based on evaluation of resumes of key personnel proposed for each firm; experience of the firm as demonstrated by providing similar services on three (3) representative projects; along with past performance by the firm, company profile and annual sales volume.

On 5/9/2012, a request for price proposals was sent to the qualifying firms, with a due date of 5/23/2012. Price Proposals were received from all requested firms for all requested regions.

On 5/9/2012, one (1) firm's technical proposal was disqualified as being not reasonably susceptible of being selected for award under this IQC.

On 5/10/2012, that firm requested a debriefing of its Technical Proposals which took place on 6/13/2012. The Chairman and the Procurement Officer determined the offeror's technical proposals are qualified and satisfied the mandatory provisions of the request for technical proposal. The Procurement Officer requested their Price Proposals with a due date of 6/19/2012.

The Qualification Committee convened on 6/4/2012 through 8/6/2012 to review the price proposals and determined a request for a Best and Final Offer (BAFO) was needed.

On 11/5/2012, a request for a BAFO was sent to the qualifying firms, with a due date of 11/16/2012. Best and Final Offers were received from all requested firms for all regions. The Qualifications Committee convened on 12/20/2012 through 1/17/2013 to review the BAFO's. Twelve (12) firms were recommended for award.

On 2/15/2013, two (2) firms' price proposals and BAFO's were not accepted due to its proposed pricing significantly exceeding the maximum allowable rates and therefore were not acceptable as being reasonably susceptible of being selected for award and were disqualified.

This contract will allow DGS to rapidly respond to critical repair needs at State facilities when the use of competitive sealed bids is not possible due to time required or, when emergency conditions exist that may subject the State to inflated pricing.

The project solicitation was posted on eMarylandMarketplace.com on May 3, 2012. Twenty-nine (29) firms responded with Letters of Interest and nine (9) firms submitted technical proposals. Six (6) of those nine (9) firms met the minimum qualifying score of 85%. It was determined that a Second Phase Review Panel evaluation was not required. At the meeting of October 31, 2012, the General Professional Services Selection Board (GPSSB) approved the Qualification Committee's recommendation of the ranking of the firms and authorized negotiations with the top ranked firm of MIN Engineering, Inc.

At the January 22, 2013 public meeting of the GPSSB, the Chairman of the Negotiation Committee certified that the negotiations were conducted in accordance with the regulations governing the Negotiation Committee, that the price proposal was based upon the scope of services outlined in the project program and DGS procedures for providing architectural/engineering services, and that the negotiated price proposal was fair, competitive, and reasonable.

The price proposal and the scope of services represented by the price proposal were reviewed by the GPSSB.
