Catch the Nam Knights mini-rolling thunder through Town at approximately 1:30 p.m. on **Saturday, May 25** and thank them for their service and continued support of our military.

The Nam Knights will have a model of a Vietnam Memorial to be placed at Veterans' Memorial Park in 2014 (target date) on hand at the Festival, Sunday, May 26. Donations will be accepted as well as an opportunity to purchase a print or win the original artwork in an auction. The artist of the original artwork is Dave Lewis. Mr. Lewis was an "In Country" artist for the United States Army in Vietnam and has art displayed at the National Army History Museum in Washington, D.C.

A free moonlight cruise Saturday evening beginning at 7:30 p.m. is open to the first 80 active military persons and their immediate families aboard the *Miss Chesapeake Beach*, the Rod 'N' Reel fishing charter head boat. The owner of the *Miss Chesapeake Beach*, Mr. Luke Thatcher, do-

nates the trip. Proper identification required.

Like to hand dance or want to learn? The American Legion will host a hand dance Saturday, May 25 at 8:00 p.m. Dance lessons begin at 7:00 p.m. Cost is \$10 per person with a 50% discount for active military personnel and guest. Cost includes beer, soda and snacks.

All weekend – free admission to the Chesapeake Beach Water Park, Bayfront Park and North Beach to all active military personnel and immediate family members as well as Veterans and their immediate family members. All must show proper identification.

The Big Day is **Sunday, May 26** at Kellam's Field. Bring the family for a day of fun learning experiences through stories, crafts, games and activities. There will be a moon bounce, super slide, miniature golf, Bingo tent (Sponsored by North Beach Volunteer Fire Department), Super Heroes of Southern Maryland, local entertainment, All American Family Day Picnic (sponsored by the American Legion Stallings-Williams Post 206), snow cones,

popcorn, cotton candy and more. There will be a tent filled with non-profit organizations that assist families of fallen heroes as well as a display of military toys and other military equipment. You can climb the rock wall with the Army National Guard. Enjoy afternoon entertainment on the open stage including Superheroes, Dave Chappell, Ladies of Twin Beach Players, Scattered Leaves and Patty Reese. Both Chappell and Reese are multiple Washington Area Music Association (WAMMIE) winners and have been heard at many local and national festivals, sporting events, theaters and clubs. A show you will not want to miss!

On **Monday, May 27** beginning at 10 a.m. at Veterans' Memorial Park, the American Legion Stallings-Williams Post 206 will host their annual Memorial Day Observance.

At 3:00 p.m. on Monday, May 27, please take a moment to participate in the National Moment of Remembrance. You can do this with a family or individual prayer, moment of silence or any way you see fit to remember those who gave the ultimate sac-

rifice for our freedom.

All events (unless otherwise stated) are free. Donations are welcomed and greatly appreciated to ensure future Festivals to celebrate the true meaning of Memorial Day and to honor our fallen heroes. ■

DREDGING

I mentioned this federally funded project in our last newsletter. I am pleased to report that this project is now complete, and the Fishing Creek channel should be easily navigable for the next five or more years. Given that there will not likely be any future federal funding, the Town Council has decided to create a "Dredging Reserve Fund" to provide the needed funding for future dredging. In the Fiscal Year 2014 budget, \$250,000 has been set aside for this purpose, and it is the Council's intention to continue this practice until it is time to dredge again. We will seek federal and state aid, but if it is not available, we will have the funds to do the work ourselves.

FISHING CREEK BRIDGE REPLACEMENT PROJECT

The project to replace the Fishing Creek Bridge is continuing to move forward and is scheduled to go to bid later this year. One very significant development since I last wrote about this is that the massive power lines on the west side of the bridge are to be tunneled under the creek, instead of putting poles back on top of the bridge. Although we were originally informed that Verizon was also planning to go underground, the latest information is that they have reversed this decision and are planning to string wires above the bridge. The Town is working diligently to keep these unsightly wires off the new bridge. I'll provide an update in the next newsletter.

BUDGETS

So far, the Town Council has passed the budgets for the General Fund, the Water Park and the Critical Area Mitigation Fund. Two funds are left— the Waste Water Treatment Plant and the Utility Fund (Water and Sewer). These final two funds have been the subject of a great deal of interest and debate for several years, especially as the growth in the Town has slowed to a crawl and the Enhanced Nutrient Removal (ENR) project contract has been awarded. These remaining two budgets will be the subject of public hearings and Town Council deliberation at the June 20 Town Council Meeting, so please come to learn of the challenges we face.

MAYOR'S NIGHT OUT

Please remember that the informal Mayor's Night Out program continues and is generally on the first Monday evening each month. Check the Town Calendar or the calendar of events in these newsletters for the dates. These meetings are no longer targeted to a specific section of Town, so come to any meeting you choose. These meetings make for a good opportunity for you to speak to me or the Town's department heads about anything that is on your mind.

Farewell Ceremony

On Sunday, April 14th, 2013, volunteers of the Chesapeake Beach Railway Museum commemorated the day the very last train left Chesapeake Beach on the Chesapeake Beach Railway: April 15th, 1935 via a "Farewell Ceremony" at 11:46 a.m. (the exact time the last train left the station), and again at 1:00 p.m. for those who could not attend the first service. Vice-President of the Friends of the Chesapeake Beach Railway Museum, Mike Sweeney, said a few words about the history of the railway and rang the station bell 35 times to represent the 35 years the railway was in service. Then he held a moment of silence for the two railway crewmen, Engineer Frederick Maier and Fireman Charles Zier, who died in the line of duty in an accident in Chesapeake Beach on July 2nd, 1900. The Chesapeake Beach Railway Museum would like to thank Chesapeake Beach Town Councilman Bob Carpenter, Calvert County Commissioner Pat Nutter, Senate of Maryland President, Thomas V. Mike Miller Jr. and other members of our community for attending this special event. This event is free and open to the public and will be repeated next year, so check your Chesapeake Beach Town calendar and please plan to attend! ■

We are scheduling appointments now for those who have pre-purchased their passes. This way you can avoid standing in lines when we are open. Traitor's Kiss, Lover's Kiss, Courtesan's Kiss, Stranger's Kiss, One More Kiss

Four Historical Romance Novels from Local Author Mary Blayney with the Fifth Book Due Out April 30, 2013

My favorite reading of all times is historical novels. My daughter introduced me to a local author, Mary Blayney, who has been writing novels since 1986. Where have I been? I had never read any of Blayney's books. Blayney was born and raised right here in Southern Maryland. To have books signed by a local author is a real treasure to me.

I have read four of Blayney's books revolving around a powerful English family, the Pennistan's. Book 5 is available April 30, and mine is on order.

The first book, *Traitor's Kiss*, tells the story about Lord Gabriel Pennistan, who has been in a French prison cell. He doesn't know why he has been rescued by Charlotte Parnell, but he finds that he is very attracted to her. After she gets him home safely, she disappears. Not satisfied that he won't ever see her again, he goes to all lengths to find her.

Lover's Kiss is the story about Lord Gabriel's sister, Lady Olivia Pennistan. She was kidnapped by someone who has been threatening her family. She escapes from the kidnapers and is rescued by a very handsome soldier, Michael Garrett, who thought she was dead when he found her in the woods. Lady Olivia, who is a very headstrong female with three brothers, takes a long time to trust Michael. Neither one believes they could be attracted to each other, but that one kiss tells all. Michael returns her safely to her family, and the excitement begins.

Courtesan's Kiss is about Lord David Pennistan, who has been asked by his brother to escort Mia Castellano to his family's home in Derbyshire where her guardian awaits her. Mia, engaged to be married, is caught in a compromising situation, and her engagement gets called off. She wants to be an independent person and decides that becoming a courtesan is the best way to live as you pleased. As Lord David starts their journey, some of the help becomes sick, and they must stop at one of the family homes in the country. Thinking it could be smallpox, they are all quarantined. Thus, starts the adventure of Lord David and Mia.

Stranger's Kiss is all about Lord Lynford Pennistan, Duke of Meryon, who is the head of the Pennistan family. After the death of his wife, Lord Lyn realizes that he should have done more to show his love for her. Reluctantly, Lord Lyn attends a ball and meets Elena Verano, who is also mourning the death of her husband. With neither one wanting to be with anyone else, their paths seem to keep putting them together, and their love begins.

One More Kiss (on the shelves April 30) is the last of the Pennistan series and is about the last brother, Jess Pennistan, who is considered the black sheep of the family as he gambles his life away. Since this book is not out yet, who knows what twists and turns will tell the story of Jess?

I could not put any of these four books down, so I can't wait to receive the last Pennistan family book. Blayney has been invited to be a guest speaker at the Twin Beaches Library and has agreed to appear soon. Inquire at the library to learn when she will visit. I am very happy to learn of this wonderful local author! ■

The Town of Chesapeake Beach invites you to spend a summer evening cruising aboard the "Miss Chesapeake Beach." Captain Luke Thatcher brought "Miss Chesapeake Beach" to the Bay in 2011. Formerly, she sailed out of Plymouth, Massachusetts taking guests bottom fishing and whale watching.

Miss Chesapeake Beach was built in 1995, is 63 feet in length and is certified by the US Coast Guard to carry 107 passengers. (The most we carry is 80.) Captain Luke grew up around here and began his career on the water by mating on other boats. Captain Luke is a young, (he is in his early 20s) laid-back captain. Most often, he comes aboard in shorts, a tee shirt and barefoot. He is always accompanied by his friend and companion, his dog Marlin. You read that right, his dog's name is Marlin. Captain Luke greets the passengers and introduces Marlin, while asking if there is anyone who does not

like dogs. If a passenger indicates that they are not comfortable about dogs Luke tells Marlin to go upstairs. Marlin then climbs the ladder, yes it's a ladder, and lays on "Marlin's Roost" throughout the trip. As the boat leaves the slip and heads out towards the Chesapeake Bay, you realize that young Captain Luke knows how to drive this big boat better than most can drive their car. Bay Restoration Fee Financial Hardship Exemption

Available for Eligible Town Residents

**Town of Chesapeake Beach, Maryland
Residential Application
Bay Restoration Fee Hardship Exemption**

On May 26, 2004, Senate Bill 320 was signed into law, creating the Bay Restoration Fund ("BRF"). The purpose of the bill was to create a dedicated fund financed by wastewater treatment plant users to be used to upgrade Maryland's wastewater treatment plants with enhanced nutrient removal (ENR) technology. On July 1, 2012, House Bill 446 increased the mandated BRF fee from \$2.50 per month to \$5.00 per month, and required that BRF fee billing authorities develop a financial hardship fee waiver plan for low income households.

Residents of the Town of Chesapeake Beach may apply directly to the Town for an exemption from the fee due to substantial financial hardship. Exemptions are valid for a one year period. Applicants may reapply annually.

Eligibility:

Proof of residency must be provided by supplying (1) A copy of applicant's photo identification, and (2) a copy of tax bill, current utility bill, or executed lease.

To be eligible for the hardship exemption, you must meet at least two of the following conditions:

- Receive energy assistance subsidy. Confirmation on official letterhead is required.
- Receive public assistance - supplemental security income (SSI) or food stamps. Confirmation on official letterhead is required.
- Receive veterans or social security disability benefits. Confirmation on official letterhead is required.
- Meet the income criteria established by the Maryland Department of Human Resources/Office of Home Energy Programs. A copy of the tax return you filed for the prior calendar year is required. ■
