Protecting Land Forever

The Maryland Environmental Trust 2018 Annual Report is prepared and submitted to the governor and General Assembly of Maryland, pursuant to the requirements of the Natural Resources Article, §3-203.10.

Maryland Environmental Trust was established by the Maryland General Assembly in 1967 as a charitable organization with state support and funding, and with an independent board of trustees. In 1969, the trust was assigned to the Department of Natural Resources.

For five decades the Maryland Environmental Trust has worked with the citizens of Maryland and partner organizations to foster the appreciation and conservation of scenic open space, natural areas and working farmlands across the state. With one of the largest portfolios of preservation and conservation easements in the nation, the trust is a leader in its field. It is responsible for perpetually stewarding these properties, some of Maryland's most iconic and culturally significant landscapes and properties.

CONSERVATION EASEMENT PROGRAM

Conservation easements - their negotiation, acquisition, recordation and stewardship - is a central part of the Maryland Environmental Trust's work. Easements that are donated by private landowners are the primary mechanism by which the trust works to accomplish its mission of preserving open space throughout the State of Maryland.

STEWARDSHIP PROGRAM

The stewardship process consists of activities essential to the long-term care of the land and sustaining landowner relationships, for every easement, in perpetuity. Staff and volunteers provide vital landowner support in many areas. These include regular site visits to property under easement; identifying funding and technical assistance to help landowners who wish to engage in voluntary stewardship programs; interpreting owners' reserved rights to ensure easement purposes are upheld; maintaining documentation and records that will support ongoing management and support; and upholding the public trust when necessary to correct easement violations, preferably through voluntary action by the landowner with counsel and guidance from the Office of the Attorney General.

VOLUNTEER PROGRAM

The program extends the outreach and presence of the trust within the Stewardship Program with the support of donated funds. Volunteer Land Stewards represent the trust, schedule visits, meet landowners, share stewardship ideas, and document changes to help preserve the conservation values that make these lands special.

LAND TRUST ASSISTANCE PROGRAM

Maryland Environmental Trust serves as the statewide land trust. Local land trusts, of which there are 37 in Maryland, work with and are assisted by the trust. The Land Trust Assistance Program helps build and sustain the quality and effectiveness of the state's land trusts, and encourages participation in a number of national programs, such as the Alliance's Land Trust Standards and Practices and the Land Trust Accreditation Commission.

KEEP MARYLAND BEAUTIFUL PROGRAM In FY18 \$307,500 Grant Money Distributed

The functions and activities of the Governor's Committee to Keep Maryland Beautiful were transferred to Maryland Environmental Trust in 1967, and it was the first program administered by the trust. The trust has awarded Keep Maryland Beautiful grants annually for decades. This program is funded by Maryland Environmental Trust, the Maryland Department of Transportation and the Maryland Department of Housing and Community Development. Grants through the Keep Maryland Beautiful program help volunteer-based, nonprofit groups, communities and land trusts in Maryland to support environmental education projects, litter removal, citizen stewardship and work to protect natural resources in urban and rural areas throughout the state.




