Annual Report on Maryland Casinos Calendar Year 2018

The Maryland Lottery and Gaming Control Commission (MLGCC), with assistance from the Maryland Lottery and Gaming Control Agency (MLGCA), is responsible for all matters relating to regulation of casino licensees. In this regulatory role, the MLGCC oversees all internal controls, auditing, security, surveillance, background investigations, licensing and accounting procedures for each of the facilities.

This annual report covers the licensee status, revenue totals, crime statistics, and community engagement activities for each casino during the reporting period of January 1, 2018 through December 31, 2018.

MARYLAND CASINOS 2018 REVIEW:

Maryland's casino industry continued to thrive in 2018 while maintaining a close watch on an evolving competitive landscape, both in the state and more broadly in the northeast corridor.

In Calendar Year 2018, Maryland's six casinos generated \$1,746,364,081 in gaming revenue. Of that amount, \$709,982,320 was contributed to state causes, including \$524,795,789 for the Education Trust Fund.

The casinos combined for \$157,960,668 in gaming revenue in October of 2018, which was an all-time record month as of that date, led by a single-month record of \$73,443,098 at MGM National Harbor. The statewide figure from October 2018 is currently the second-best in the program's history, having been surpassed by revenues of \$163,262,848 in March of 2019.

A Supreme Court ruling on May 14, 2018, cleared the way for states to operate legalized sports wagering. During the second half of the year, sports betting launched at casinos in Delaware, New Jersey, Pennsylvania and West Virginia. While Maryland's casino operators were monitoring competitors in nearby states, they spent 2018 investing in their properties and expanding amenities to drive gaming revenue growth:

- Gaming revenue at the six casinos increased 8.2% year-over-year, and casino contributions to the state increased 8.0% year-over-year, including a 9.2% increase in contributions to the Education Trust Fund. Casino employment increased 7.5%, from 7,180 (5,798 full-time) at the end of 2017 to 7,719 (6,278 full-time) at the end of 2018.
- MGM opened a second-floor gaming area on July 13, 2018, and saw year-over-year gaming revenues improve by 15.8%. MGM ended 2017 with 2,484 employees (1,998 full-time). As of December 31, 2018, the casino had increased to 2,786 employees (2,156 full-time).
- Live! opened its hotel and events center on July 11, 2018, providing the property with new marketing and revenue opportunities. Year-over-year gaming revenues increased 5.6% in 2018. New hiring followed at Live! as well. The casino ended 2017 with 2,535 employees (2,047 full-time). As of December 31, 2018, the casino had 2,621 employees (2,181 full-time).
- Ocean Downs launched its first 10 table games just before New Year's Day, on December 29, 2017, and added eight more tables in July of 2018. The new gaming options propelled 24.8% year-over-year growth in the property's revenue in 2018, and also necessitated new hiring. Ocean Downs ended 2017 with 258 employees (225 full-time). As of December 31, 2018, the casino had 351 employees (302 full-time).
- Horseshoe began working on plans for an entertainment district adjacent to the property, and on May 8, 2018, announced that a Topgolf complex will open by 2020 along Warner Street between M&T Bank Stadium and the casino. Horseshoe had 1,285 employees (1,104 full-time) at the end of 2017. As of December 31, 2018, the casino had increased to 1,358 employees (1,213 full-time).
- Hollywood completed its green energy initiative, which included the installation of new LED lamps and fixtures to retrofit existing incandescent, fluorescent and halogen lamps and fixtures. It also resurfaced a truck parking lot devoted to larger commercial vehicles. Hollywood's employment decreased from 299 at the end of 2017 to 266 at the end of 2018. Most of the difference was in the part-time employee figure, which went from 129 to 98.
- Rocky Gap remodeled rooms on three floors of its resort and opened a new high-limits gaming area. Rocky Gap's employment increased modestly from 319 at the end of 2017 to 337 as of December 31, 2018, including an increase of four full-time positions.

- Operated by Gaming & Leisure Properties, Inc.
- The casino opened on September 27, 2010, and was Maryland’s first casino.
- In calendar year 2018, the casino generated \$75,614,379 in gaming revenue, with 822 slot machines and 19 table games.
- 801,524 patrons visited the casino in 2018.
- The casino employed 266 staff members.

January 2018

- **Hollywood** – Participated in two community events with charitable donations/sponsorships.
- **Ocean Downs** – Sponsored and participated in a charitable event.
- **Live!** – Served as the presenting sponsor of a fundraising event, with a \$8,000 sponsorship, where staff volunteered their time to serve as dealers at casino games.

- ***Live!*** – Collected toys for the local Toys for Tots program, in which team members volunteered their time to sort and pack toys for distribution to needy families; allowed Marines to conduct a coin drop, which raised more than \$3,000 in donations; delivered and installed a new 70-inch television at a fire station's renovated recreation room; and hosted a roundtable discussion/meeting for the county economic development corporation, providing the space, food and beverage gratis.
- ***Rocky Gap*** – Collected toys for the Toys for Tots program for underprivileged children in the community; and assisted local mall staff by volunteering to wrap gifts for holiday shoppers.
- ***Horseshoe*** – Adopted 50 Baltimore City families, providing more than 1,200 gifts of food, clothing and toys; and sponsored four community programs totaling \$13,000 in sponsorships.
- ***MGM*** – Participated in two community service projects in which team members partnered and volunteered their time to adopt 11 families in Prince George's County to fulfill their holiday wish lists, and to wrap more than 700 Christmas toys for children in shelters and for those transitioning out of homelessness.
