on the said twelfth day of August in the year aforesaid, at the City aforesaid, unlawfully did keep a certain place, to wit: a room for the purpose of selling lottery tickets, contrary to the form of the Act of Assembly in such case made and provided, and against the peace, government and dignity of the State.

### THIRD COUNT.

And the Jurors aforesaid, upon their oath aforesaid, do further present that the said FLORENCE COPPER

on the said twelfth day of August in the year aforesaid, at the City aforesaid, unlawfully and knowingly did permit a certain room there situate, of which she was then and there the owner, then and there to be used as a place for selling lottery tickets, contrary to the form of the Act of Assembly in such case made and provided, and against the peace, government and dignity of the State.

entitle the purchaser or holder to receive money, property and evidence of debt; she the said





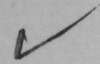
