- 2. That the orator is the presiding officer of the second Subordinate Past and Supreme Officers' Council.
- 3. That the orator believes that the order has on deposit in the Eutaw Savings Bank, Eutaw and Fayette Streets, the Calvert Bank, Howard and Saratoga Streets, and in Harry O. Wilson's Bank, 407 W. Franklin Street over \$400.00. Said \$400.00 having been deposited in these banks to pay the sick and death claims of its members and to defray the general expenses of the order.


