Area within the heavy black lines not used for a future pond is a potential sanitary landfill site.

All surface water drains to the center of the pits. There is no drainage from the pits to existing streams.

The dwelling near the center of the area, owned by E. B. Baker & Sons, Inc., will eventually be moved.

No test borings have been taken.

Area for which application is made - 52.1 Acres.

Sediment control & future development:  
1. All future mining operations are to be conducted so that there will be no surface drainage leaving the pit.  
2. Areas within the pit not used as a pond or sanitary landfill will be seeded with tall fescue at 60 lbs./acre with 1 ton/acre of ground limestone and 1000 lbs./acre of 10-10-10 fertilizer.

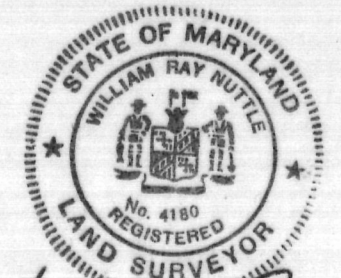
