The Answer of Thomas J. Clark, to the
petition of Richard S. Proctor, in the
matter of Windsor vs. Proctor and others,
in the Circuit Court of Baltimore City,
respectfully shews, that on, or about the
summer of Eighteen Hundred and seventy
four, a judgment was had before a
Justice of the Peace of the City of Baltimore
in favor of Richard S. Proctor against
Glendy S. Windsor; further shewing that,
your respondent represented the said
Proctor in said matter as aforesaid, and
in his capacity as attorney called on
the said Windsor for the purpose of
Effecting a settlement of said judgment
as aforesaid; that said Windsor repeat-
-edly promised to pay said judgment
- but failed to do so; that said judg-
-ment still remains unpaid and
- satisfied; that your respondent has
no moneys, or other matter, arising out
said relation as attorney for said
Proctor, in his possession belonging to
said Proctor; further shewing that,
said Windsor has admitted his
willingness to pay said judgment and
promised to do the same, before the said

day of July of the present year;

further showing to your Honor
that the said judgment as aforesaid
still remains whole and entire, and
that your respondent still feels
bound to enforce the collection of the
same from said Winder for the ben-
-efit of said Proctor.
