It is on this nineteenth day of February 1887, Ordered by the Supreme Bench of Baltimore City that Jacob S. Rosenthal <sup>Esq</sup> show cause on or before the nineteenth day of March 1887 why his name should not be struck from the roll of Attorneys at law of this Court, by reason of the decree passed against him on the 15<sup>th</sup> of October 1885 by the Circuit Court of Baltimore City in the case of William J. Poole vs Jacob S. Rosenthal, which decree was on appeal affirmed by the Court of Appeals on the 22<sup>nd</sup> of June 1886, it appearing <sup>the record of said case and</sup> by said decree and also <sup>reported in "85 Md. Reports" p 418</sup> by the opinion of the Court of Appeals, that said Rosenthal had by false and fraudulent representations defrauded the said William J. Poole of a large sum of money.

It is further ordered that a copy of this order be served on said Jacob S. Rosenthal on or before the 25<sup>th</sup> day of February 1887.

To the Honorable, the Judges

of the Supreme Bench

of Baltimore City:

Jacob S. Rosenthal upon whom a rule has been laid by this Honorable Court to show cause why his name shall not be struck from the Roll of Attorneys at Law, for the reasons set forth in said rule and hereinafter stated, now shows cause in obedience to the <sup>exi</sup>urgency of said rule as follows:

The Rule requires this respondent to show cause as aforesaid, and states as the ground of said order that it is passed "by reason of the decree passed against him on the 15th of October 1885, by the Circuit Court of Baltimore City in the case of William J. Poole vs Jacob S. Rosenthal, which decree was on appeal affirmed by the Court of Appeals on the 22nd day of June 1886, it appearing by the Record of said case and said decree, and also by the Opinion of the Court of Appeals reported in 65 Md. Reports page 418, that said Rosenthal had by false and fraudulent <sup>reason</sup> reputations, defrauded the said William J. Poole of a large sum of money."

This Respondent admits that the decree referred to in the rule established conclusively his pecuniary liability

to the Complainant in that suit, and he has satisfied said decree while he considered that it was unjust to himself.

But he denies that either the decree of the Circuit Court, or that of the Court of Appeals rightly understood, as applied to the record in the case, convicts him of any misconduct, or warrants the conclusions drawn therefrom as set forth in the rule.

He denies the charge contained in the rule and is prepared to establish his innocence to the satisfaction of this Court, and he prays that he may not be subjected to the cruel delay in vindicating his character and reputation as prescribed by the rule, but that he may have a hearing at the earliest day this Honorable Court can assign, prior to the 19th of March to which day said rule is made returnable.
