May it please your Honor to grant unto your Oratrix the Order of Publication directed against the said Chauncey Milton Davis, a non-resident of the State of Maryland, commanding and requiring him to be in this Court on some day certain to be named therein to answer the premises and abide by and perform such decree or order as may be passed therein.
