(2) That said alleged Will was not executed by the said L. Victoria Handy when she was of sound and disposing mind and capable of executing a valid deed or contract.

(3) That the said L. Victoria Handy at the time of the alleged execution of the alleged Will, was in such mental and physical condition by reason of the disease from which she was then suffering, that she did not know or understand the contents of the aforementioned alleged Will.

(4) That the execution of said alleged Will was procured by the undue influence exercised and practiced on the said L. Victoria Handy, deceased and constraining her Will therein.

And your petitioner prays, that the said Frederick Douglass may be required to answer the premises and that the Order of this Honorable Court admitting to probate said alleged Will, may be annulled and set aside and that the Letters Testamentary granted to the said Frederick Douglas may be revoked.
