To the SHERIFF of BALTIMORE CITY, Greeting:

WHEREAS, on the 5th day of July, 1928, before A. Lowenson, a Justice of the Peace of the State of Maryland, in and for the City of Baltimore, Commissioned and sworn, a certain Carroll Independent Coal Co.

by judgment of the said Justice of the Peace, recovered against a certain J. Stewart Davis and Blanche M. Davis Defendants

as well as the sum of Ninety seven dollars and 87 cents, for its damages, with interest from the 5th day of July, 1928, as the sum of One dollars and -- cents for its costs and charges by it about its suit laid out and expended, whereof the said

Defendants are convict

AND WHEREAS, the said judgment has been duly recorded in the office of the Clerk of the Superior Court of Baltimore City, in Liber 117 No. 105 folio one of the Records for Judgment obtained before a Justice of the Peace for Baltimore City.

THEREFORE YOU ARE HEREBY COMMANDED TO ATTACH any of the lands, tenements, goods, chattels and credits of the said Defendants

if they should be found in your bailiwick, to the value of the damages, costs, and charges aforesaid, and when you have the same so attached, or any part thereof, the same in your custody shall safe keep, so that you have the same before the Superior Court to be held at the Court House in the City of Baltimore on the second Monday of March next, then and there to be condemned according to the Acts of Assembly in such case made and provided, to and for the use of the said Carroll Independent Coal Co

unless the said

J. Stewart Davis and Blanche M. Davis

shall come then and there by themselves or lawful attorney, and show cause to the contrary. And you are likewise commanded to make known to each person or persons in whose hands or possession the said lands, tenements, goods, chattels and credits of the said

J. Stewart Davis and Blanche M. Davis

shall be attached, that he, she or they be and appear at the said Court at the day and place aforesaid, to show cause (if he, she or they have any), why the said lands, tenements, goods, chattels and credits so as above said in his, her or their hand attached, should not be condemned, and execution thereof had and made as in other cases of recoveries and judgments given in Courts of Record, according to the directions of the Acts of Assembly aforesaid, if to him, her or them it shall seem meet.

And how you shall execute this writ, make known unto the said Court on the day and at the place aforesaid, and have you then and there this writ.
