The Jurors of the State of Maryland, for the body of the City of Baltimore, do on their oath present that CHARLES A. WARNER and RUBY A. WARNER otherwise called JAMES R. PETERS late of said City, on the fifth day of February in the year of our Lord nineteen hundred and twenty-eight about the hour of halfpast four o'clock in the night of the same day, at the City aforesaid, the dwelling house of Moses S. Hecht

there situate, feloniously and burglariously did break and enter, with intent then and there the goods and chattels, moneys and properties of the said Moses S. Hecht in the same dwelling house then and there being found, then and there feloniously and burglariously to steal, take and carry away, and then and there, in the same dwelling house

One jewelry box of the value of twenty-five dollars current money,
Three pencils, each pencil of the value of eleven dollars and eighty-five cents current money,
Three cigarlighters, each cigarlighter of the value of six dollars current money,
One locket of the value of twenty-five dollars current money,
One scarfpin of the value of fifteen dollars current money,
Three hundred and thirty-eight diamonds, previously severed from the realty, each diamond of the value of forty dollars current money,
Twenty-eight emeralds, previously severed from the realty, each emerald of the value of thirty dollars current money,
Two sapphires, each sapphire of the value of twenty-five dollars current money,
