State of Maryland,

City of Baltimore, to wit:

The Jurors of the State of Maryland, for the body of the City of Baltimore, do on their oath present that **CHARLES A. WARNER and RUBY A. WARNER otherwise called JAMES R. PETERS** late of said City, on the **fifth** day of **February** in the year of our Lord nineteen hundred and **twenty-eight** about the hour of **four o'clock** in the night of the same day, at the City aforesaid, the dwelling house of

there situate, feloniously and burglariously did break and enter, with intent then and there the goods and chattels, moneys and properties of the said **Harry B. Wolf**

in the same dwelling house then and there being found, then and there feloniously and burglariously to steal, take and carry away; and then and there, in the same dwelling house

Four pencils, each pencil of the value of three dollars and seventy-five cents current money,

One penknife of the value of fourteen dollars current money,
One cigarette case of the value of ten dollars current money,
Five studs, each stud of the value of two dollars and fifty cents current money,

Two cufflinks, each cufflink of the value of two dollars and fifty cents current money,

One cigarlighter of the value of five dollars current money,
Twenty-six dollars current money of the value of twenty-six dollars current money,
