#### DEFENDANT'S PRAYER.

Notwithstanding the jury shall find from the evidence that the Defendant was guilty of negligence, yet if they shall further find from the evidence, that the Plaintiff was also guilty of negligence, and that the accident was caused partly by the Defendant's negligence and partly by the Plaintiff's negligence, then the verdict must be for the Defendant, without regard whose negligence was the greater.

#### Defendant's Prayer.

The Defendant prays the Court to instruct the jury, that
the mere happening of the accident raises no presumption of
negligence on the part of the Defendant operating the automobile, but that the burden is upon the Plaintiff to establish by
a fair preponderance of evidence that negligence on the part
of the Defendant caused the accident, and that if the minds of
the jury are left by the evidence in a state of even balance
as to the existence of such negligence, then the verdict must
be for the Defendant.

#### PLAINTIFF'S FOURTH PRAYER.

The Court is requested to instruct the Jury that if they find a verdict for the plaintiff, they may, in estimating the damages to be allowed, consider what was the pecuniary loss which the said Mary Adams has sustained by reason of her having been negligently injured and may consider the reasonable probability of the permanency of her injury and may allow her such damages as in the judgment of the jury would compensate her for such pecuniary loss as she has sustained, and reasonably will sustain by reason of said injuries.
