To the Honorable, the Judge of said Court:

Your orators, complaining of the defendants, say:

1. That Mary Rebecaa Adkins, sometimes referred to as Mary Adkins, late of Baltimore City, deceased, a widow, departed this life, on the 5th day of January, 1925, and left surviving her, six children, namely, Samuel, David, James, Moses, Rebecca Smith and Mary Goddard.

2. That Mary Rebecca Adkins, during her lifetime, resided at No. 503 N. Eden Street, Baltimore City and died as a result of several strokes of paralysis, appoplexy and other diseases with which she was afflicted, and that coupled with her advanced age, not only became infirm and helpless in body, but her mind was so enfeebled and impaired as to render her unfit for the transaction of any business and was utterly incapable of making a valid deed or contract and so remained up to the date of her death.

3. That during the continuancy of the infirmity of the said Mary Rebecca Adkins and during her imbecility and incapability, as aforesaid, she being then at the age of seventy eight years, was on or about the ^{3rd} day of September, 1924, induced through fear, coercion, fraud and misrepresentation of the defendants, to sign a certain paper, purporting to be a deed and presuming to convey her leasehold property No. 503 N. Eden Street Baltimore City, subject to a ground rent of fifteen dollars (\$15) and of the probable value of five thousand dollars (\$5000), unto Rebecca Smith and Mary Goddard, which pretended deed, is filed

herewith, marked "Exhibit A" and prayed to be made a part of this bill and it is further alleged, that through fear, coercion, fraud and misrepresentation she was forced to assign her right, title, and interest in all money she had on deposit in the Savings Bank of Baltimore unto Mary Goddard.

4. That the said pretended deed and the assignment of her interest in the Bank Deposit of the Savings Bank of Baltimore will deprive your orators of all their right, title and interest of every sort, to which they are entitled, and will strip the rightful heirs at law, of the said Rebecca Adkins, of whatever interest they may be entitled to, as children of the said decedent.

5. That the said pretended deed is wholly without legal consideration, is fraudulent and void, and should be set aside by a Court of Equity.

6. That the assignment of her interest in the bank deposit in the Savings Bank of Baltimore is without legal consideration, is fraudulent and void and should be set aside.

To the end, therefore,

(1) That the said pretended deed or instrument of writing purporting to have been made and executed on or about the ^{3rd} ~~3th~~ day of September, 1924, by Mary Rebecca Adkins, sometimes referred to as Mary Adkins, to Rebecca Smith and Mary Goddard, ^{or Mary Goddard} may be annulled and set aside by a decree of this Court.

(2) That the said pretended assignment of the interest of Mary Rebecca Adkins, sometimes referred to as Mary Adkins, in a fund on deposit with the Baltimore Savings Bank unto Mary Goddard, may be annulled and set aside by a decree of this Court.

(3) That an injunction be issued, restraining ~~the Director~~ ~~the~~ the Savings Bank of Baltimore from paying out any money now on deposit in said Bank, on any pass book, to the credit of Mary Rebecca Adkins, or Mary Adkins and Mary Goddard, or to the credit of Mary Goddard, individually, or accepting any order

drawn by either of said parties, ~~unless cause to the contrary~~
~~be shown on or before the~~ day of _____, 1925;
~~providing a copy of this Order be served on Rebecca Smith, Mary~~
~~Goddard and the Savings Bank of Baltimore, the defendants, on or~~
~~before the~~ day of January, 1925.

(4) That your orators may have such other and further relief as their case may require.

May it please your Honor to grant unto your orators the writ of subpoena, directed to the said Rebecca Smith, Mary Goddard and the Savings Bank of Baltimore, commanding them to be and appear in this Court at some certain day to be named therein, and answer the premises and abide by and perform such decree as may be passed therein.

FIRST: That as to the matters and facts alleged in paragraphs first to sixth, inclusive, this Defendant, having no knowledge, except as hereinafter otherwise expressly stated, can neither admit nor deny the same, and calls for strict proof thereof so far as they or any of them may affect the rights or obligations of this Defendant.

SECOND: Answering further said Bill of Complaint, this Defendant says that its records show that an Account known as Account No. 666069 was opened on July 28, 1915, in the name of Rebecca Adkins, Junior, in trust for herself and Rebecca Adkins, her Mother, subject to the order of either, the balance at death of either to belong to the survivor, and that there have been no transactions in this Account, except a deposit of \$20.

That the records of this Defendant also show that there was an Account opened some years ago in the name of Rebecca Adkins in trust for herself and Rebecca Adkins Jr., her daughter, subject to the order of either and on the death of either to belong to the survivor, which account was known as No. 666068, and which Account was closed on April 20th, 1922, and the balance

was re-deposited to credit of Account known as No. 712522, standing in the name of Rebecca Adkins, which last mentioned Account was closed on April 23rd, 1924, and the balance was deposited to the credit of Account on the Books of this Defendant, known as No. 726706 in the name of Rebecca Adkins in trust for herself and Mary C. Goddard subject to the order of either and on the death of either to belong to the survivor. This last mentioned Account was closed on January 7th, 1925, and the balance was re-deposited to an account standing in the name of Mary C. Goddard, widow, known as No. 720475.

That Having thus fully answered said Bill of Complaint this Defendant prays to be hence dismissed with costs.

1. That they admit the allegations and statements as contained in the first paragraph of the bill of complaint.
2. That they deny with great emphasis that the said Mary Rebecca Adkins, deceased was enfeebled in mind and mentally impaired so that she was incapable of making a valid Deed or contract.
3. That they deny with great emphasis that any force, coercion, fraud, or misrepresentation was practiced upon the aforementioned Rebecca Adkins by them in order to induce her to sign a deed transferring to them of the leasehold property, 503 N. Eden Street; and Mary Goddard emphatically denies that any force, coercion, fraud or misrepresentation was practiced on Rebecca Adkins, deceased to induce her to assign her right, title and interest in money in the Savings Bank of Baltimore to Mary Goddard.
4. As to the fourth paragraph of the bill of complaint, your respondents aver that the deed was valid and the assignment of interest in bank deposit was valid; and that the complainants have no rights in the leasehold property and bank deposit.
5. As to the fifth paragraph of the bill of complaint, the defendants deny that the deed is fraudulent and void.

6. As to the sixth paragraph of the bill of complaint, the defendants deny that the assignment of interest was fraudulent and void.

7. That Mary Rebecca Adkins, deceased at the time of the assignment of her interest in money on deposit at The Savings Bank of Baltimore and at the time of execution and delivery of deed of which " Exhibit A" is a copy, was of sound and disposing mind and that she understood and was fully capable of making a valid deed and contract.

8. That the plaintiffs are in nowise entitled at law or in equity to said leasehold property, 503 N. Eden Street or the money that was on deposit to the credit of Mary Adkins at the Savings Bank of Baltimore.

And these defendants pray to be hence dismissed with their costs of suit.

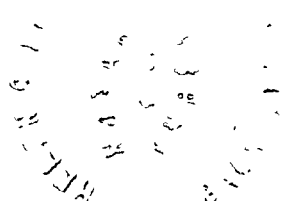
