TO THE HONORABLE, THE JUDGE OF SAID COURT:

Your Oratrix complaining respectfully represents:

1. That she was married to her husband William Young on the 12th day of May, 1899 and with whom she resided until the 2nd day of January, 1906 when the defendant deserted the plaintiff.
2. That though the conduct of your Oratrix toward the said William Young has always been kind, affectionate and above reproach, he has, without any just cause or reason, abandoned and deserted her and has declared his intentions to live with her no longer; that such abandonment has continued uninterruptedly for more than three years and is deliberate and final and the separation of the parties is beyond any reasonable expectation of reconciliation.
3. That your Oratrix has not lived or co-habited with the said defendant since said desertion.
4. That there are no minor children as issue of said marriage.
5. That both your Oratrix and the defendant are citizens of the State of Maryland, having resided in Baltimore City for more than three years prior to the filing of this Bill of Complaint.

TO THE END, THEREFORE :

(a) That your Oratrix may be divorced A Vinculo Matrimonii from the said William Young.

(b) That she may have such other and further relief as her case may require.

May it please your Honor to grant unto your Oratrix the Writ of Subpoena directed against the said William Young, commanding and requiring him to be and appear in this Court on some day certain to be named therein to answer the premises and abide by and perform such decree or order as may be passed therein.

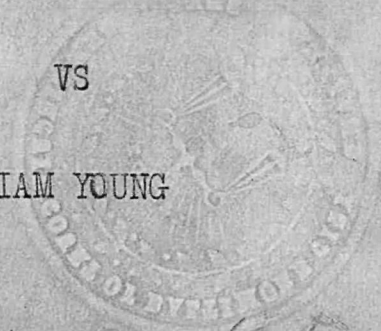
