office of the Examiner in the City and State
aforesaid, as the time and place for such examination of witnesses in said cause;
at which last mentioned time and place I attended, due notice of such meeting
having been given, and proceeded in the presence of the Solicitor _____ of the
Plaintiff to take the following deposition, that
is to say:—

HELEN BOND, the Plaintiff, produced as a witness on her own behalf, being duly sworn, deposes and saith as follows- that is to say-

BY THE EXAMINER:

1 Q- State your name, residence and occupation?

A - Helen Bond, 1630 E. Madison St., Baltimore; laundress.

2 Q- Do you know the parties to this suit?

A- I am Helen Bond, the plaintiff, and James Bond is my husband.

BY MR. DAVIS:

3 Q- When, where and by whom were you married?

A- June 26th, 1916.

4 Q- Where were you married?

A- I was married at the residence of the Rev. Neal of the First Baptist church, in the City of Baltimore, State of Maryland.

5Q- Any children born of this marriage?

A- No sir.

6 Q- How long have you been a resident continuously, prior to the date of the filing of this bill, of the city of Baltimore, State of Maryland?

A- I have been in Baltimore now into the fourth year.

7 Q- How long has your husband been a resident of Baltimore City?

A- I don't know how long he has been a resident of Baltimore City, I think he was a Baltimorean, and has lived here all the time I know him.

Helen Bond.

8 Q- Where did you and your husband live together as husband and wife?

A- On Jefferson St.

9 Q- Are you now living together?

A- No sir.

10 Q- When did you separate and which one left the other?

A- He left me , went out of the house June 28th, 1916, the second day after we were married.

11 Q- What was your treatment and conduct towards your husband during the whole of your married life?

A- I have been a good, true wife. He only lived with me for two days, and he left.

12 Q- Did he say anything when he left?

A- He packed his valise at night and went out, saying nothing.

13 Q- Have you seen him or had any conversation with him since?

A- No sir, haven't had nay conversation with him.

14 Q- Has he in any way directly or indirectly contributed to your support?

A- Nothing at all.

15 Q- Any children born of this marriage?

A- No sir.

16 Q- Has he ever attempted to come back and offered you a home?

Helen Bond.

A- No sir, I have never seen him.

17 Q- If he had, at any time, wanted to return, he could have come back?

A- Yes sir, he could have come home if he had come back.

18 Q- Have you lived with or cohabited with him in any way since?

A- No sir.

19 Q- Has the abandonment of you by your husband continued uninterruptedly for at least three years prior to July 3d, 1919?

A- Yes, he left a little over three years- now- going on four.

20 Q- Was his abandonment his own deliberate and final act?

A- It certainly was. He had no cause to leave me.

21 Q- Is there any hope that you would be reconciled and live together again?

A- No sir, no chance in the world.

PRESTON B. LIPSCOMB, a witness produced on behalf of the Plaintiff, being duly sworn, deposeth and saith as follows- that is to say-

BY THE EXAMINER:

1 Q- State your name, residence and occupation?

A - Preston B. Lipscomb, 1630 E. Madison St.; Laborer.

2 Q- Do you know the parties to this suit?

A- Yes sir, Helen Bond is my mother and James Bond is my step-father.

BY MR. DAVIS:

3 Q- Are the parties to this suit, Helen Bond, and James Bond, man and wife, and if you say they are, tell me how you know it?

A- By seeing the license. I saw the license and I know they were married by the Rev. Mr. Neal of the First Baptist Church, at his house in Baltimore City, and they came home and lived together for two days, when he walked off.

4 Q- You have just testified that the defendant left your mother, his wife, two days after they were married, what day were they married?

A- They were married June 26th, 1916, and he walked off the night of June 28th, 1916.

5 Q- What cause, if any, did your mother give him to make him leave her?

A- Not any to my knowing.

6 Q- Were there any children born of this second marriage?

Preston B. Lipscomb.

A- No sir.

7 Q- Has or not your mother and step-father been residents of the City of Baltimore, State of Maryland for more than two years prior to July 3d, 1919?

A- Yes sir, much more.

8 Q- Have you seen or had any talk with your step-father since he abandoned your mother on the night of the 28th day of June, 1916?

A- I have seen him, but never had any talk with him.

9 Q- Has he, to your knowledge, made any efforts to resume the marital relation with his wife, your mother?

A- No sir, I know he has not been to the house, and has not communicated to her, and I believe he has never as much as even spoken to her.

10 Q- Has he in any way, directly or indirectly, contributed to her support?

A- No sir, he has not, he has not given her a cent.

11 Q- Has he or not, to your knowledge, made any effort to return to your mother and provide her with a home?

A- No sir, he has not.

12 Q- Has the separation and abandonment here complained of continued uninterruptedly for at least three years prior to the third day of July, 1919, the day this bill was filed?

A- He left on the 28th of June, and that's a few days more than three years, and it has been ever since then.

A- No, sir.






