- 2. That on or about the 29th day of May. 1925, Bessie Smith died. That her death was not caused by any of the causes exempted in said policy of insurance and that the said Bessie Smith fulfilled all the conditions of said insurance on her part.
- That the plaintiff, Charles Brotton was beneficiary under said policy. That the plaintiff has made due proof of the death of said Bessie Smith and his own right as beneficiary under said policy in accordance with the requirements of said policy. That the defendant refused and continues to refuse to pay the amount of the claim though often requested to do so.

WHEREFORE the plaintiff claims \$250.00.damages.
