Louis Brown, plaintiff, by Davis and Evans his attorneys, sues the defendant, L. Gordon and Sons, Incorporated.

For that whereas the plaintiff to wit: on the 14th day of September, 1924 at Baltimore City in the State of Maryland, was driving his wagon along and upon a certain public highway at or near to its intersection with another certain street or highway known as Lanvale Street at said intersection; and the said defendant, its agents, servants or employees, were operating an automobile of the defendants' upon and along said street.

And while the said Louis Brown, with due care for his own safety and the safety of others, was driving across or turning into said Lanvale Street at the crossing aforesaid, the defendant, whose duty it was to cause said automobile to approach and pass said crossing there, with great care, caution and diligence, did by its servants, then and there, so carelessly and negligently cause said automobile to be driven to and over said crossing that said automobile ran into and struck against the plaintiff's horse with great force and violence, and thereby the plaintiff's horse was injured and became sick, sore, lame and disordered and so remained for a long time, during all of which time the plaintiff was deprived of the services of said horse; and the plaintiff was forced and did spend divers sums of money in attempting to cure his horse of his hurts and wounds.
