HENRY CLICK : IN THE CIRCUIT COURT

TO THE HONORABLE, THE JUDGE OF SAID COURT:

Your Orator complaining respectfully represents:

1. That he was married to his wife, Edna Click March 25, 1913 and with whom he resided until about the 25th day of December 1918 when the defendant deserted the plaintiff.
2. That though the conduct of your Orator toward the said Edna Click has always been kind, affectionate and above reproach, she has, without any just cause or reason, abandoned and deserted him and has declared her intentions to live with him no longer; and that such abandonment has continued uninterruptedly for more than three years and is deliberate and final, and the separation of the parties is beyond any reasonable expectation of reconciliation.
3. That there is one child, Nathaniel, about ten years of age born as issue of said marriage.
4. That your Orator is a citizen of the State of Maryland having resided in Baltimore City for more than three years prior to the filing of this Bill, but that the defendant is a non-resident.
5. That your Orator has not lived or co-habited with the said defendant since said desertion.

TO THE END, THEREFORE:

(a) That your Orator may be divorced A Vinculo Matrimonii from the said Edna Click.

(b) That he may have such other and further relief as his case may require.

May it please your Honor to grant unto your Orator the Order of Publication directed to the said Edna Click, commanding her to be and appear in this Court on some day certain to be named therein, to answer the premises and abide by and perform such decree or order as may be passed therein.

The object of this bill is to procure a divorce *A*
Vinculo Matrimonii by the plaintiff from the defendant.

The bill recites that the parties were married March
25, 1913; that the plaintiff has been a resident of the State
of Maryland for more than three years and that the defendant
is a non-resident. That the defendant, Edna Click, deserted and
abandoned the plaintiff without any just cause or reason on the
25th day of December, 1918. That said abandonment and desertion
has continued uninterruptedly for more than three years and is
deliberate and final and that there is no hope or reasonable
expectation of reconciliation. That there is one child, Nathaniel,
age ten years born as issue of said marriage.

It is thereupon, by the Circuit Court of Baltimore
City, this *28* day of *March* 1925, ordered that the plaintiff
by causing a copy of this order to be inserted in some daily
newspaper, published in Baltimore City once a week for four
successive weeks before the *29* day of *April* 1925, give
notice to the absent defendant Edna Click, of the object and
substance of this bill of complaint and warn her to be and
appear in this Court in person, or by Counsel, on or before the
15 day of *May* 1925 and show cause, if any she may have,
why a decree ought not be granted as prayed.
