WHEREAS, James Crosby (C)

hereinafter called the Traverser, after having been informed by me of his right to have a trial by jury on the charge hereinafter mentioned, preferred against the said Traverser on the oath of Off' Edward Syambroski and having thereupon declared that he wished to waive his said right to a trial by jury, and abide by the determination of said charge by me, and the State's Attorney for the City of Baltimore not having, before the trial of said offense, prayed a jury trial on behalf of the State of Maryland; was thereupon, on this 28th day of February 1926, duly tried before the undersigned, a Justice of the Peace of the State of Maryland in and for the City aforesaid, duly selected to sit at the Southwestern Police Station House, upon the charge of, and was thereupon on said trial found guilty of the offense of

Assault and striking one Edward Syambroski

on or about the 27th day of February 1926, in Baltimore City, State of Maryland, and it was thereupon adjudged that the said Traverser for the said offense should pay a fine of \$50.00 dollars and 45 cents and One Dollar and 45 cents costs; and it was further adjudged that if the said sum should not be paid forthwith, the said Traverser should be imprisoned in the Baltimore City Jail, until such payment be made, or until the said Traverser should be discharged by due course of law; and

WHEREAS, the said Traverser has not paid the said fine and costs, or any part thereof, but therein has made default.

NOW, THEREFORE, you are hereby commanded to receive from any officer the body of the said Traverser and hold him safely keep in your Jail and custody until the said fine and costs shall have been paid or until the said Traverser shall be thence discharged by due course of law.

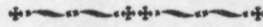
