WHEREAS Lottie Dempsey (c) hereinafter called the Traverser, after having been informed by me of her... right to have a trial by jury on the charge hereinafter mentioned, preferred against the said Traverser on the oath of Off. John Brown... and having thereupon declared that She wished to waive her... said right to a trial by jury, and abide by the determination of said charge by me, and the State's Attorney for the City of Baltimore not having, before the trial of said offense, prayed a jury trial on behalf of the State of Maryland, was thereupon on this 2nd day of April 1922, duly tried before the undersigned, a Justice of the Peace of the State of Maryland in and for the City aforesaid, duly selected to sit at the Northwestern Police Station House, upon the charge of, and was thereupon, on said trial found guilty of the offense of Unlawfully Being a Common

prostitute

on or about the 1st day of April 1922, in Baltimore City, State of Maryland, and it was thereupon adjudged that the said Traverser for the said offense should be imprisoned in the Baltimore City Jail for Thirty (30)

NOW, THEREFORE, you are hereby commanded to receive from any officer the body of the said Traverser and her... safely keep in your Jail and custody until the said Traverser shall be thence delivered according to law.
