TO THE HONORABLE, THE JUDGE OF SAID COURT:

Your Oratrix complaining respectfully says:

1. That she was married to her husband, George Dixon on or about the 5th day of April, 1915 and with whom she resided until about the 14th day of July, 1924 when the defendant deserted the plaintiff.
2. That though the conduct of your Oratrix toward the said George Dixon has always been kind, affectionate and above reproach, he has without any just cause or reason, abandoned and deserted her and has declared his intention to live with her no longer, that such abandonment is deliberate and final and the separation of the parties is beyond any reasonable expectation of reconciliation.
3. That there are three children born as issue of said marriage, ages ten years, four years and two years.
4. That your Oratrix is destitute and without funds for her support, and the support of the three children. She is advised by Counsel that she may petition this Honorable Court that she may be granted separate support, and maintenance for herself and children, and a reasonable amount as counsel fee to compensate her solicitor. *Defendant earns about 35⁰⁰ a week*
5. That both your Oratrix and the defendant are citizens of the State of Maryland, having resided in Baltimore City for

more than two years prior to the filing of this Bill of Complaint.

WHEREFORE YOUR ORATRIX PRAYS:

1. That she be granted separate support and maintenance for herself and children.

2. Alimony pendente lite. *and counsel fee*

3. Such other and further relief as the case may require.

May it please your Honor to grant unto your Oratrix the Writ of Subpoena directed against the said George Dixon, commanding and requiring him to be and appear in this Court on some day certain to be named therein to answer the premises and abide by and perform such decree or order as may be passed therein.


TO THE HONORABLE-THE JUDGE OF SAID COURT:
