COMMITMENT-HOUSE OF CORRECTION

STATE OF MARYLAND, WICOMICO COUNTY, TO-WIT:

To the Superintendent of the Maryland House of Correction, greetings:

WHEREAS, Charles Farlow, late of Wicomico County, aforesaid, being brought before me, the subscriber, a Justice of the Peace of the State of Maryland, in and for Wicomico County, aforesaid, and being informed by me of his right to trial by jury, freely elected to be tried by me, the subscriber, and a jury trial not being prayed on the part of the State of Maryland, by the State's Attorney, was this twenty-third day of June, nineteen hundred and nineteen, duly tried upon the charge, on the information and oath of Charles R. Dennis, Bailiff, that the said Charles Farlow, was unlawfully an habitually disorderly person, not insane, and leading a dissolute and disorderly life, contrary to the form of the Act of the General Assembly in such case made and provided, and against the Peace, Government and Dignity of the State, of which offense he was by me found guilty, and I, therefore, gave judgment and sentence that the said Charles Farlow, for his said offense should be imprisoned in the Maryland House of Correction for six months.

This is, therefore, to command you to receive the said Charles Farlow into your custody in the said Maryland House of Correction there to imprison him for the said space of six months, and for so doing this shall be your sufficient warrant.
