She is advised by Counsel that she is permitted to petition this Honorable Court that the defendant shall be compelled to contribute a reasonable amount as alimony pendente lite towards the support of your Oratrix and children, and that she will also be awarded an amount in order to compensate her Solicitor.

Your defendant is employed as clerk in the Post Office and earns an average of sixteen hundred and fifty dollars per year.

TO THE END?THEREFORE:

a) That your Oratrix may be divorced a Vinculo Matrimonii from the said Algernon M.A.Jackson.

(b) That she may have such other and further relief as her case may require.

(c) That this Honorable Court will decree that the defendant pay a reasonable sum as alimony pendente lite and an additional sum as Counsel fee.

(d) Permanent alimony.

(6) Right to resume her maiden name, Dandge.

May it please your Honor to grant unto your Oratrix the Writ of Subpoena directed against the said Algernon L. Jackson, commanding and requiring him to be and appear in this Court on some day certain to be named therein to answer the premises and abide by and perform such decree or order as may be passed therein.
