COMMITMENT TO HOUSE OF CORRECTION.

State of Maryland , Talbot County, Sct.

To the Superintendent of the Maryland House of Correction, Greeting

WHEREAS, Isaiah Fountain was brought before me, a Justice of the Peace of the State of Maryland, in and for the County aforesaid and Police Justice in and for the Eastern District thereof and sitting in Eastern District charged on the oath of Robt. F. Cooper with the offense of Cruelty to Animals in Talbot Co Maryland, Eastern District, on or about Jan 21, 1917.

and after having been informed by me of his right to have a trial by jury of said charge, and having thereupon declared that he wished to waive his said right and abide by the determination of said charge by me was thereupon on this 23 rd day of Jan A. D. 1917 tried before me and found guilty of said offense and sentenced to be confined in the Maryland House of Correction for a period of One Year from this date ----- 1

This is therefore to command you to receive the said Isaiah Fountain into your custody in the Maryland House of Correction there to imprison him for the space of One Year from this date, Jan 23 1917----or he be discharged in due course of law, and for so doing this shall be your sufficient warrant. Given under my hand and seal this 23 rd day of Jan A.D. 1917
