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Edward Hackett, by his attorneys, Davis and Evans, sues  
The Luxor Cab Company, a body corporate.

1. For that heretofore to wit: at the time of the happening  
of the accident hereinafter referred to, the defendant company was  
and still is a common carrier of passengers by means of taxi cabs  
in the City of Baltimore.

2. That on or about the 28th day of November, 1926 the  
plaintiff was injured as a result of a collision between a car  
of the defendant Company and another automobile, which collision  
resulted from the negligently and careless operation of the taxi  
cab owned by the defendant corporation, which taxi cab was then  
and there under the care and control of the servants, agents or  
employees of the defendant company and as a result the plaintiff  
was injured sorely and was sore and disordered for a long time,  
and is prevented from performing his usual occupation and was  
forced and did spend divers sums of money in attempting to cure  
himself of his hurts and wounds occasioned as aforesaid.

3. And the plaintiff says that all of his injuries and  
damages were caused by the carelessness, negligence and want of  
due care on the part of the defendant Company, its servants, agents  
or employees or either of them and that he in no wise contributed  
thereto.

WHEREFORE suit is brought and the plaintiff claims  
\$5000.00 damages.
