7. That both your Orator and the defendant ~~are~~ citizens of the State of Maryland, having resided in Baltimore City for more than three years prior to the filing of this Bill.

TO THE END, THEREFORE:

(a) That your Orator may be divorced A Mensa et Thoro from the said Jauinitia Hughes.

(b) That he may have such other and further relief as his case may require.

May it please your Honor to grant unto your Orator the writ of suppoena directed against the said Jauinitia Hughes, commanding and requiring her to be and appear in this Court on some day certain to be named therein to answer the premises and abide by and perform such decree or order as may be passed therein.
