Bennie Jackson, plaintiff by his attorneys, Davis and Evans, sues David Goldstein, defendant.

For that while the plaintiff, to wit: on or about the 3rd day of November, 1925 was a passenger in a Premier Cab that was being operated or driven along and upon Holliday street in a southerly direction at or near to the intersection of Holliday street with Water street, both public highways of Baltimore City, the cab in which he was a passenger was struck by an automobile owned and operated by the defendant, said automobile being then and there operated or driven along and upon Water street in a westerly direction at or near to the intersection aforesaid.

And while the chauffeur, operator or driver of the cab was operating the cab in a careful manner as aforesaid, the defendant negligently and carelessly ran into and against the cab turning it over and throwing the plaintiff against the sides and walls of the cab, and seriously injured him about the head, limbs and body and as a result thereof he became and was sick, sore, lame and disordered and so remained for a long time, to wit: from thence hitherto during all of which time he was prevented from performing his usual occupation and was forced to and did spend large sums of money in attempting to cure himself of his hurts and wounds occasioned as aforesaid.

And the plaintiff says that all of his injuries as aforesaid and damages were caused by the negligence, carelessness and want of due care on the part of the defendant and that neither

the plaintiff nor the cab driver in anywise contributed thereto.

WHEREFORE suit is brought and the plaintiff claims
\$5,000.00 damages.
