TO THE HONORABLE, THE JUDGE OF SAID COURT:

Your Orator complaining respectfully says:

FIRST: That he was married to the defendant, Martha Lewis, on or about Sept. 4th, 1911 in Hamer, S.C.

SECOND: That on or about the 11th day of March, the defendant, Martha Lewis compelled your Orator to leave their common place of abode.

THIRD: That on or about the 15th day of September, 1920, Your Orator opened a grocery store at 214 Colvin Street, the said store was financed solely by your Orator; that although the license for said store is in the name of Martha Lewis, the store was owned solely by your Orator.

FOURTH: That some time in the year 1919, your Orator gave the defendant Martha Lewis a sum of money approximately to the amount of six hundred (\$600) dollars, which the said defendant, Martha Lewis was to retain for the use of your Orator.

FIFTH: That almost immediately after receiving the above amount of money, the defendant, Martha Lewis, opened an account in The Provident Savings Bank in her name alone. That the defendant, Martha Lewis did not notify your Orator that she had placed the money to her order alone until two or three months after it had been done.



SIXTH: That the defendant, Martha Lewis continued to deposit the earnings of your Orator, which Orator was employed at Bethlehem Steel Company, prior to opening the aforementioned grocery store.

SEVENTH: That the said defendant, Martha Lewis, continued to deposit the earnings of the aforementioned grocery store in the aforementioned account at the Provident Savings Bank.

EIGHTH: That the said defendant, Martha Lewis, has refused to permit your Orator to continue to live at 214 Colvin Street or to indulge in the aforementioned grocery business.

NINTH: That the defendant, Martha Lewis is now contributing large sums of money to the support of one Henry Dailey, with whom the defendant, Martha Lewis is now living.

TENTH: That the aforementioned grocery store is the sole property of your Orator and that the money represented by the aforementioned account in the Savings Bank of Baltimore, is the money earned by your Orator at the Bethlehem Steel Co. and the profits of the aforementioned grocery store.


ELEVENTH: That there is grave danger that the aforementioned grocery business of your Orator will be ruined and that the large amount of money now held by the defendant, Martha Lewis will be squandered by being deprived of the enjoyment of his business and the use of his money in bank unless this Court will grant your Orator the Writ of Injunction restraining the said Martha Lewis from withdrawing said money or any part thereof and the said Bank from paying Martha Lewis any part thereof, as your Orator will be without remedy in action at law, as the defendant is not possessed of any property, real, or personal.

WHEREFORE YOUR ORATOR PRAYS;

1. That the said, Martha Lewis be restrained and enjoined from withdrawing money in aforementioned Provident Savings Bank and that she be made to account for the same, if already withdrawn.
2. That an order be passed by this Honorable Court enjoining and restraining the Provident Savings Bank of Baltimore, a body corporate, from paying over any money or monies standing in the name of the above mentioned Martha Lewis, unto her or any person for or on her behalf.
3. That the said Martha Lewis be ordered and directed by a decree of this Court to account for aforementioned money to your Orator.
4. Such other and further relief as the case may require.

May it please Your Honor to grant unto your Orator a Writ of Subpoena, directed unto the defendants, Martha Lewis and the Provident Savings Bank, a corporation, of Baltimore, Maryland, commanding them and each of them to be and appear in this Honorable Court in person or by Solicitor, on some day certain to be named therein to show cause if any they may have, why a decree should not be passed as prayed.

Your Orator complaining respectfully says:

FIRST: That heretofore, to wit on the 28th day of March 1922, he filed his bill of complaint in this Court against a certain Martha Lewis and the Provident Savings Bank of Baltimore, a corporation, praying amongst other things an injunction restraining the said Martha Lewis from drawing certain funds from the Provident Savings Bank and restraining the Provident Savings Bank from payingba any monies from certain funds to the said Martha Lewis.

SECOND: That your Orator failed to state in the aforementioned bill of complaint that your Orator is unable to read or write and that the respondent, Martha Lewis, for said reason would never permit your Orator to control the money received either as a result of your Orator's earnings from the Bethlehem Steel Company or the profits received from the grocery store and that the respondent is able to read and write; and that your Orator believed that the deposits of your Orator's money made by the respondent, Martha Lewis, were as much for the benefit of your Orator as though the deposits had been made by your Orator.

THIRD: That through inadvertence the tenth and eleventh paragraphs of your Orator's bill of complaint in the original bill of complaint does not state your Orator's

conclusions as clearly as said conclusions should be stated, wherefore your Orator prays leave to amend the aforementioned eleventh paragraph to read as follows:

TENTH: That the aforementioned grocery store is the sole property of your Orator and that the money represented by the aforementioned account in the Provident Savings Bank is the money earned by your Orator at the Bethlehem Steel Company and from the profits of the aforementioned grocery store.

ELEVENTH: That there is grave danger that the aforementioned grocery business of your Orator will be ruined and that the large amount of money of your Orator's now held by the respondent will be squandered and that there is grave danger of your Orator's being deprived of the enjoyment of his business and the use of his money deposited in bank unless this Honorable Court will grant your Orator the Writ of Injunction restraining the said Martha Lewis from withdrawing said money or any part thereof and restraining the said bank from paying Martha Lewis any part thereof; as your Orator will be without remedy in <sup>an</sup> action at law, since the defendant is not possessed of any property, real or personal.

Your respondent, Martha Lewis, in answer to the Bill of Complaint and Amended Bill of Complaint, heretofore filed in the above entitled cause, respectfully states unto Your Honor as follows:

1. That she admits the allegations as contained in the first paragraph of said Bill of Complaint.

2. That your respondent denies the allegations as contained in the second paragraph of said Bill of Complaint.

3. That in answer to the third, seventh, eighth and eleventh paragraphs of said Bill of Complaint, your respondent admits that she opened a grocery store at 214 Colvin Street on or about the 15th day of September, 1920, but denies that the said business was financed solely by the complainant, but on the contrary, says that said business was started and financed solely by herself, and that said business belongs solely to your respondent.

4. That your respondent denies the allegations as contained in the fourth paragraph of said Bill of Complaint.

5. That in answer to the fifth, sixth and tenth paragraphs of said Bill of Complaint, your respondent states that on or about the 27th day of September, 1920, she opened an account with the Provident Savings Bank of Baltimore, depositing the sum of sixty dollars, which sum, as well as all subsequent deposits in said bank was the money belonging solely to your

respondent, and which she accumulated by her own earnings.

6. That your respondent denies the allegations as contained in the ninth paragraph of said Bill of Complaint.

Your respondent further states that there were three children born to the parties hereto, and that for the past two years the said complainant has failed to provide for the support of your respondent and their three minor children, and that for the past two years your respondent, through her own efforts and earnings derived from the business conducted by herself at No. 214 Colvin Street, supported herself and her said three minor children, and in addition thereto, was able to accumulate the sum of one hundred and seventy dollars and thirty cents, said sum now being on deposit in her name in the Provident Savings Bank of Baltimore. That not only did the said complainant fail to contribute to the support of your respondent and his said three minor children, but that for the past two years the said complainant often demanded money of your respondent and that your respondent on numerous occasions was compelled to give the said complainant various sums of money, and that on or about the 12th day of December, 1921, your respondent was compelled to give to the said complainant the sum of one hundred and fourteen dollars.

WHEREFORE and for other reasons to be shown at the hearing of this cause, your respondent respectfully prays that said Bill and Amended Bill of Complaint be dismissed, and that the Order Nisi heretofore passed by this Honorable Court restraining your respondent from withdrawing the amount on deposit to her credit at the Provident Savings Bank of Baltimore, be rescinded.




