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Henry Mayfield, father and next friend of St. Elmore Mayfield, infant, by his attorneys, Davis and Evans, sues Jacob Lerner, defendant.

I. For that on or about the 20th day of September, 1925 while the plaintiff, St. Elmore Mayfield, was alighting from a street car on Franklin Street, he was struck by an automobile owned and operated by the defendant, who was then and there operating his automobile along and up said Franklin Street in an easterly direction. And as a result thereof the infant plaintiff was thrown down and against the street and he was then and there seriously injured about the head, body and limbs and he was caused to and did suffer great physical pain and mental anguish and as a result thereof he was prevented from performing his usual duties.

And the plaintiff says that all of his injuries were caused by the carelessness, negligence and want of due care on the part of the defendant and that he in no wise contributed thereto.

WHEREFORE suit is brought and the plaintiff claims \$15000.00 damages.
