I. For that Henry Mayfield is the father of St. Elmore Mayfield, infant. That on or about the 20th day of September, 1925 the plaintiff's son was struck by an automobile owned and operated by the defendant on Franklin street as he was alighting from a street car. And as a result thereof the plaintiff's son was thrown down and against the street and he was then and there seriously injured about the head, limbs and body and the plaintiff was forced to and did spend divers sums of money in attempting to cure his son of his hurts and wounds occasioned as aforesaid and he was deprived of the services of his son for a long time, to wit: from thence hitherto.

And the plaintiff says that all of his aforesaid injuries and damages were caused by the carelessness, negligence and want of due care on the part of the defendant and that neither he nor the infant son in any wise contributed thereto.

WHEREFORE suit is brought and the plaintiff claims \$5,000.00 damages.
