1. That on or about the 6th day of July 1924, Alice Brogden mother of the petitioner, was rendered insane as a result of notice of her husband having been lost in the fire of the Steamer Threc Rivers.
2. That the said Alice Brogden is now confined at the Bay View Institution for the insane.
3. That the present mental condition of the said Alice Brogden is such that she is not capable of performing the acts of a sane person.
4. That the said Alice Brogden has an interest in five hundred (\$500) dollars, which is to be paid to the Estate of Elisha Brogden, late husband of the said Alice Brogden.

WHEREFORE, your petitioner prays that because of the facts as contained in the above petition and affidavit, that this Honorable Court will declare the said Alice Brogden, temporarily deranged and mentally incompetent to administer her estate and that a Committee be appointed to administer the estate of the said Alice Brogden.



It is further ordered that Elizabeth Hall be and is hereby appointed Committee of the estate of the said Alice Brogden with full power and authority to take charge of and manage the property of the said Alice Brogden under the direction of this Court, but before the said Elizabeth Hall shall proceed to act as such Committee, she shall give bond to the State of Maryland to the amount of five hundred dollars with surety or sureties to be approved by this Court or the Clerk hereof for the faithful discharge of her duties as such Committee.


