TO THE HONORABLE, THE JUDGE OF SAID COURT :

The Petition of James Hitchens respectfully says:

1. That James Hitchens is a resident of Baltimore City, State of Maryland, and that he is the brother of William Hitchens.
2. That the said William Hitchens as a result of sickness and disease is suffering from a pronounced nervous disorder. That the mentality of the said William Hitchens is impaired seriously.
3. That the present condition of the said William Hitchens is such that he is not capable of performing the acts of a sane person.
4. That the said William Hitchens turned over to one, Emma Hitchens, his aunt, approximately \$425 at or about the time of his illness.
5. That the said Emma Hitchens, has refused and continues to refuse to use the funds to secure the proper medical treatment and support the said William Hitchens.
6. That your petitioner prays that because of these facts as contained in the above petition and affidavit, that this Honorable Court will declare the said William Hitchens temporarily deranged and mentally incompetent to administer his estate, and that this Honorable Court will further declare that your petitioner be appointed his guardian and that the *Century* Trust Company be appointed committee to administer the estate of the said William Hitchens.

Such other and further relief as the case may
require.


