





That the party of the first part hereby remises, releases, quit-claims and forever discharges the said Baltimore Trust Company party of the second part, Committee as aforesaid, or its assigns, etc., from any and all claims, actions, proceedings and demands whatsoever for or on account of the said guardianship or any act or thing growing out of or in anywise connected therewith.
