TO THE HONORABLE, THE JUDGE OF SAID COURT:

The petition of Ida Doles respectfully shows:

FIRST, That Ida Doles is a resident of the city of Baltimore, State of Maryland and that she is the foster mother of one Charles Smith. That she has raised the said Charles Smith since he was eleven months of age. That the said Charles Smith has no parents now living; and that she, the petitioner, is related to the said Charles Smith, by blood, as his Aunt.

SECOND, That the said Charles Smith enlisted in the United States Regular army some time prior to the late World War; that during the late war, the said Charles Smith served in France That while the said Charles Smith was in France, he, the said Charles Smith, fell from a truck and struck his head. As a result of said fall the said Charles Smith was unconscious for weeks and his recovery ~~of~~^{was} despaired of. Upon recovering consciousness the said Charles Smith was dangerously insane, making it necessary for those in authority to committ the said Charles Smith to a place of detention for insane soldiers, That it was necessary at that time to place a guard over the said Charles Smith in order to prevent his doing himself personal harm. That the said Charles Smith was shipped to the United States as an insane soldier and was committed to a cell while enroute to the United States. That upon arriving in the United States March 13, 1919 the said Charles Smith was committed to the Government hospital for the insane soldiers at East Norfolk, Massachusetts. While at the hospital in East Norfolk it was also necessary to keep the said Charles Smith in a locked room, by reason of his mental derangement. The said Charles Smith remained in the aforesaid hospital at East Norfolk from the time of his return to the United States in March 1919 until about April 7th. 1919, at which time he was discharged from army because of his mental disability.

He returned to the home of your petitioner in Baltimore. While at the home of your petitioner, the mental condition of the said Charles Smith became so alarming that it was necessary to commit the said Charles Smith to a government hospital for insane ex-service men at Pittsburg, Pa. The said Charles Smith was so committed to said hospital in the year of 1920 for treatment. After treatment in the aforesaid hospital in Pittsburg, Pa. the said Charles Smith again returned to the home of your petitioner. In April 14, 1921, the said Charles Smith again became so violent that he was committed to a government hospital for insane service men at Staten Island, New York. remaining there for treatment until September 2, 1921. Returning to the home of your petitioner on that date.

THIRD: That the present condition of the said Charles Smith is such that he is subject to a recurrence of violent periods at which time he is totally deranged mentally and incapable of performing the acts of a sane person; and that the said Charles Smith may at any time become so violent and dangerous that he will have to be committed to some institution for the insane.

FOURTH: That the said Charles Smith has been awarded a sum ~~of~~ monthly by the United States government by way of compensation for the aforementioned injuries that the amount of the compensation so awarded is approximately ninety dollars per month. That there is an accumulation of compensation in arrears held to the credit of the said Charles Smith by the United States government . That the United States Veteran Bureau of the United States government has notified your petitioner that the accumulated installments and the monthly installments to become due will not be paid except to guardian appointed by a court of competent jurisdiction.

a- That your petitioner prays that because of the facts as contained in the above and the petition and affidavit, that this Honorable Court will declare the said Charles Smith temporarily deranged and mentally incompetent to administer his estate

and that this honorable Court will further declare that a committee be appointed to administer the estate of the said Charles Smith.

b- Your petitioner further prays that this Honorable Court will appoint your petitioner as committee of the estate of the said Charles Smith.

c- Your petitioner further prays such other and further relief as the your honorable Court shall decree.


