TO THE HONORABLE, THE JUDGE OF SAID COURT:

Your Oratrix complaining respectfully represents:

That she was married to her husband, Alexander Rowlett, on the 16th day of March, 1915, and with whom she resided until about the 12th day of May, 1922, when the defendant deserted the plaintiff.

That ever since said marriage, your Oratrix has behaved herself as a faithful, chaste and affectionate wife, toward the said Alexander Rowlett.

That the said Alexander Rowlett, has on divers days and times since said marriage, committed the crime of adultery with divers, lewd and abandoned women, whose names to your Oratrix are unknown. That said offense has not been condoned by your Oratrix.

(4)

That there are no children as issue of said marriage.

(5)


That your Oratrix is a citizen of the State of Maryland having resided in Baltimore City for more than three years prior to the filing of this Bill, but that the defendant is a non-resident of the State of Maryland and when last heard of was in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania.


TO THE END, THEREFORE:

- (a) That your Oratrix may be divorced a vinculo matrimonii from the said Alexander Rowlett.
- (b) That she may resume her maiden name, BARKESDALE.
- (c) That she may have such other and further relief as her case may require.

May it please your Honor to grant unto your Oratrix the Order of Publication directed against the said Alexander Rowlett, a non-resident of the State of Maryland aforesaid, commanding and requiring him to be and appear in this Court on some day certain to be named therein to answer the premises and abide by and perform such decree or order as may be passed therein.

ORDER OF PUBLICATION

The object of this bill is to procure a divorce a vinculo matrimonii by the plaintiff from the defendant.

The bill states that the parties were married on the 16th day of March, 1915 and lived together until about the 12th day of May, 1922, when the defendant deserted the plaintiff. That there are no children as issue of said marriage. That the defendant has on divers days and times since said marriage committed the crime of adultery with divers, lewd and abandoned women and said offense has not been condoned by your Oratrix. That your plaintiff is a resident of the State of Maryland and has been for more than three years last past but that the defendant is a non-resident and when last heard of, was in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania.

It is thereupon this *22* day of *May* 1924, ordered by the Circuit Court of Baltimore City that the plaintiff by causing a copy of this order to be published in Baltimore City once in each of four successive weeks, before the *24* day of *June* 1924, give notice to the absent defendant of the object and substance of this bill, warning him to be and appear in this Court in person or by solicitor, on or before the *10* day of *July* 1924, to show cause, if any he may have, why a decree should not be passed as prayed.
