TO THE HONORABLE, THE JUDGE OF SAID COURT:

Your Oratrix complaining respectfully says:

(1) That she was married to her husband, Robert N. Tripps, on the 27th day of June, 1922 and with whom she resided until on or about the 25th day of October, 1926.

(2) That for some years past the said defendant has treated the plaintiff with great cruelty, harshness and brutality, at times striking and beating her and that his conduct has now become so intolerable that she can endure it no longer.

(3) That your Oratrix has always conducted herself as a faithful, chaste and affectionate wife.

(4) That the defendant has committed the crime of adultery with divers, lewd and abandoned women, whose names at present, are to your Oratrix unknown and that the said facts were committed without her procurement, connivance or consent and that she has not lived with him nor condoned the offense since she discovered the same.

(7) That the defendant is a resident of Baltimore City, State of Maryland, but that the plaintiff is a non-resident.

(a) That she may be divorced A Vinculo Matrimonii from the said Robert N. Tripps.

(b) Alimony pendente lite.

(c) Permanent alimony and Counsel fees.

(d) Care and custody of child.

(e) Such other and further relief as her case may require.

Tripps, commanding and requiring him to be and appear in this Court on some day certain to be named therein to answer the premises and abide by and perform such decree or order as may be passed therein.


