TO THE HONORABLE, THE JUDGE OF SAID COURT:

Your Oratrix complaining respectfully represents:

1. That she was married to her husband, Irvin Williams on the 13th day of December, 1919 and with whom she resided until on or about the 10th day of December, 1923 when the defendant deserted the plaintiff.
2. That though the conduct of your Oratrix toward the said Irvin Williams, has always been kind, affectionate and above reproach, he has, without any just cause or reason, abandoned and deserted her and has declared his intentions to live with her no longer and such abandonment has continued uninterruptedly for more than three years and is deliberate and final and the separation of the parties is beyond any reasonable expectation of reconciliation.

- (a) That she may be divorced A Vinculo Matrimonii from the said Irvin Williams.
- (b) That she may resume her maiden name "HAWKINS".
- (c) That she may have such other and further relief as her case may require.

May it please your Honor to grant unto your Oratrix the Writ of Subpoena directed against the said Irvin Williams commanding and requiring him to be and appear in this Court on some day certain to be named therein to answer the premises and abide by and perform such decree or order as may be passed therein.
