Your Oratrix complaining respectfully represents:

1. That she was married to her husband, George D. Young on the 12th day of May, 1925 and with whom she resided until the 26th day of July, 1925.
2. That ever since said marriage your Oratrix has behaved herself as a faithful, chaste and affectionate wife toward the said George D. Young.
3. That the said George D. Young has on divers days and times since said marriage, committed the crime of adultery with divers, lewd and abandoned women, whose names are unknown to your Oratrix and said offense has not been condoned by your Oratrix.
4. That your Oratrix has not lived or co-habited with said defendant since she discovered his said adulteries.
5. That there are no children born as issue of said marriage.
6. That your Oratrix is destitute and without funds for her support. She is advised by Counsel that she may petition this Honorable Court that she may be granted alimony pendente lite, permanent alimony and a reasonable amount as counsel fee to compensate her Solicitor. The defendant is employed and earns about thirty-five dollars per week.

7. That both your Oratrix and the defendant are citizens of the State of Maryland, having resided in Baltimore City for more than three years prior to the filing of this Bill of Complaint.

TO THE END, THEREFORE:

- (a) That your Oratrix may be divorced A Vinculo Matrimonii from the said George D. Young.
- (b) Alimony pendente lite.
- (c) Counsel fee.
- (d) Permanent alimony.
- (e) Right to resume her maiden name WILLIAMS.
- (f) Such other and further relief as her case may require.

May it please your Honor to grant unto your Oratrix the Writ of Subpoena directed against the said George D. Young, commanding and requiring him to be and appear in this Court on some day certain to be named therein to answer the premises and abide by and perform such decree or order as may be passed therein.
