Last Will & Testament.

In the name of God, Amen! I, Felix Gilders
a native of Ireland and for many years a resident and citizen
of the United States, being weak of body but of sound and dis-
posing mind, wishing to settle my temporal affairs, for the benefit of my family and my
own peace of mind, Do make this my last will & testament, viz. — I will, devise & bequeath
after the payment of my just debts, all my real & personal estate of whatever kind it
may be to my wife Mary Gilders during her life; Provided she does not marry
to be used for her & her children's benefit and at her death to be equally divided
between her children. Should she marry, then & in that case, it will go to the children
at once to be equally divided among them. I moreover wish should my personal estate
also it, a building to be erected in front of the present residence in Taccoa Street adjoining
the same for the benefit of my wife Mary Gilders and her children & to be held by her in
the manner & condition above specified. I moreover annul all former wills & testaments
by me made and declare this alone to be my last will and testament. I moreover ap-
point John G. Gilders, executor of the same. And as I have perfect confidence in

him, I request that no security should be required of him as my executor. In Testimony
whereof I affix my hand and seal this ninth day of September in the year of our Lord
eighteen hundred & thirty six.

Peter Sauerwein's
Last Will & Testament.

In the name of God, Amen! I, Peter Sauer-
wein Senior of the City of Baltimore, being weak in
health, but of sound disposing mind memory and un-
derstanding, being anxious to dispose of my worldly affairs before it shall please God
to call me hence, do make this my last will and testament as follows: First and
principally, I commit my soul to Almighty God, and after my body has been decently
buried at the discretion of my Executor herein after named, and my debts and funeral
expenses are paid, I give and devise unto my daughter Elizabeth, the wife of John
C. Rau my house and lot number 65, on the west side of Howard Street, and my
one other house and the lot belonging thereto on the East side of the Pennsylvania
Avenue, together with the following annuities or ground rents, to wit: one annuity of
thirty five (\$35) dollars payable upon my lot on Biddle Alley; another annuity of
sixty five dollars (\$65) upon a lot leased to James L. Ridgely on the same alley; one
other annuity of twenty one (\$21) upon a lot at the N. W. intersection of Howard
Street and Hagon Alley; and a further annuity of one dollar and thirty three cents (\$1³³/₁₀₀)
upon the lot on the South side of Saratoga near Howard Street, together with all my
right property and Estate in the aforesaid lots to her and her heirs forever. Also the
fee simple, and all my right property and interest in and to another lot, unimproved
fronting fifty feet on Biddle Alley aforesaid, being the next lot but one from the lots
on which the two first aforesaid annuities are reserved, to her and her heirs; and I also
give unto my said daughter Elizabeth Rau, Three shares of Baltimore and Ohio Rail
Road, and thirty eight shares of Fireman's Insurance Company's stock. (S.M.)
