as follows that my lands goods and Challeds to be Sold at vantage
and that twenty pound current money to be paid yearley to the
Support of my four Children begotten of ann Goulds brough
that is to say James Thomas Anne Robert till they come to
the age of seven years old and the Rest of the money to be
Equally Divided Between my four Children James Thomas
Anne and Robert I like wise appoint my Brother James
Harris my hol and Soul Executor of this my last
Will and Testament making all Wills or Wills By
me maid in witness where of I have heard unto Set my Hand
and Seal this 2^d of August 1791

Evangelists of almighty God that they did see the Testator therein named
sign and Seal this Will, and that they heard him publish pronounce
and declare the same to be his last Will and Testament; that at the
time of his so doing he was to the best of their apprehensions of
sound and disposing mind memory and understanding; and
that they respectively subscribed their names or mark as Witnesses
to this Will in the presence and at the request of the Testator, and
