I very much appreciate your willingness to take up the Hall of Records matters for me.

Mr. Daniel R. Randall, Chairman of the Site Committee of the Tercentenary Commission, thinks that the building ought to be located on the St. John's Campus, and I have accordingly written Mr. Gordon, President of the College, accepting his offer. It only remains now to agree with the College on the actual location, and, of course, there will be no difficulty about that.
