## A BILL

#### ENTITLED

AN ACT to provide for the commemoration of the three hundredth anniversary of the founding of Maryland, and to authorize the creation of a State debt in the aggregate amount of five hundred thousand dollars (\$500,000), the proceeds thereof to be used for paying the costs and expenses incident thereto, and particularly in the acquisition in the name of the State of certain historical sites hereinbelow mentioned, and the construction thereon of certain memorials hereinbelow specified, and the construction and equipment of a "Memorial Hall of Records" on land to be acquired in Annapolis for the housing and preserving of the official and historical records of the Province and State of Maryland and other documents, and for other purposes; and providing generally for the issue and sale of certificates of indebtedness evidencing such loan, and providing that said commemoration, acquisition of sites, construction of memorials, and said Hall of Records shall be under the authority and direction of the "Maryland Tercentenary Commission" appointed by the Governor, and confirmed and authorized by Chapter 470 of the Acts of the General Assembly of Marvland of 1929 and providing for the appointment by the Governor of a standing commission to be known as the "Maryland Tercentenary Memorial Commission," consisting of not more than five citizens of Maryland, one of whom shall be a resident of Saint Mary's County, to take charge of and care for certain of said memorials when completed, to serve without

pay, and providing for an annual appropriation for their expenses; and providing as incidental to said commemoration for the purchase of eight thousand (8,000) copies of the Enoch Pratt Free Library's historical picture map of Maryland, and providing for the preparation and exhibition of motion pictures of historical scenes, places and events illustrative of life in Maryland.

WHEREAS, In view of the approaching Tercentenary of the 1 founding of Maryland, and the fact that the original settlers 2 sailed from Cowes, Isle of Wight, England, in the "Ark" and 3 the "Dove" November 22, 1633, and made their first tempo-4 rary landing on or about March 25, 1634, on Saint Clement's 5 Island, in the Potomac River, Maryland, and at Saint Mary's 6 City March 27, 1634, they permanently settled and there estab-7 lished a free representative government, providing, for the first 8 9 time in history, separation of church and State, and securing to the people of Maryland religious toleration and the right to 10 11 worship according to the dictates of their own consciousness; and 12

13 WHEREAS, Because the State has never erected at said places any memorial commemorative of said events, nor any memorial 14 to the memory of George Calvert, the First Lord Baltimore 15 and Projector of the Province, nor any to Cecil Calvert, the 16 Second Lord Baltimore and first Proprietary of the Province, 17 under whose wise direction said beneficent government was 18 19 initiated and maintained, and because no adequate repository for the preservation of the irreplaceable records made and left 20 to posterity by the founders of the Province and State has ever 21 been provided by the State, and because it is the laudable de-22 sire of all good citizens of the State that said notable persons 23 24 should be specially honored, and said unprecedented events and achievements should be commemorated; therefore, 25

1 SECTION 1. Be it enacted by the General Assembly of 2 Maryland, That the commemoration of the three hundredth 3 anniversary of the founding of Maryland shall be duly and 4 properly celebrated, under the authority and direction of the 5 Maryland Tercentenary Commission heretofore appointed, as 6 aforesaid, and that in order to provide therefor, a loan is here-

.

by created to be known as the "Maryland Tercentenary Loan 7 8 of 1931" to the amount of five hundred thousand dollars (\$500,000.00). Said loan shall bear date July first, 1931, 9 10and shall bear interest at a rate to be fixed by the Governor 11 of the State, the Comptroller of the Treasury, and the Treasurer of the State constituting the Board of Public Works, or 1213a majority of them, not to exceed four and one-half (41/2)14 per centum per annum, and said interest shall be paid semiannually, and the said loan and every part thereof, and the 15interest payable thereon shall be and remain exempt from State, 16 17county and municipal taxation, and the principal amount of said loan shall be paid upon the serial annuity plan herein-18 19below specified, all within fifteen years after the issuance thereof. 20

SEC. 2. And be it further enacted, That in issuing the cer-1 2 tificates of indebtedness for said loan as herein provided in 3 Section 1, the Governor, the Comptroller of the Treasury and the Treasurer of the State, constituting the Board of Public 4 Works, or a majority of them, shall issue said certificates ac-5 cording to what is known as a serial annuity plan, and the 6 series as issued shall be lettered, beginning with the letter "A", 7 8 and so on down the alphabet until the said amount of five hundred thousand dollars (\$500,000.00) shall have been issued, 81/2

And be it further enacted, That the Governor, 1 SEC. 3. Comptroller of the Treasury, and Treasurer of the State, con-2 stituting the Board of Public Works, or a majority of them, 3 are hereby authorized and directed to have prepared proper 4 certificates of indebtedness of the State in good and sufficient 5 form to aggregate the amount of five hundred thousand dollars 6 (\$500,000.00) as evidence of such loan; such certificates of 7 indebtedness shall bear date as of the time of their issue, as 8 provided in Section 1 of this Act, and may be issued in sums 9 of one hundred dollars (\$100.00) or any multiples thereof. 10 Each of said certificates shall be signed by the Treasurer of 11 the State and countersigned by the Comptroller of the Treas-12ury and shall bear interest at the rate fixed by resolution of the 13 said Board of Public Works, payable semi-annually, and any 14 portion or all of said certificates may be registered, or not reg-15 16 istered, and the said certificates, or any portion thereof, shall have interest coupons attached, or said certificates or any por-17 tion thereof shall not have interest coupons attached, all as the 18 Governor, Comptroller of the Treasury, and Treasurer of the 19 State constituting the Board of Public Works, or a majority 20 of them, shall determine. 21

SEC. 4. And be it further enacted, That in order to pro-1 2 vide for the selling of the certificates of indebtedness aforesaid, to be issued under the provisions of this Act, the Governor, 3 Comptroller of the Treasury, and Treasurer of the State, con-. 4 stituting the Board of Public Works, or a majority of them, 5 are hereby directed to advertise twice a week for four succes-6 7 sive weeks before the said certificates of indebtedness, or any part thereof, shall be issued in two newspapers published in 8 the City of Baltimore, that the Treasurer of this State will be 9 10 in readiness at a time within fifteen days after the expiration of said notice to receive bids at such place or places as may be 11 named in said respective advertisements for bonds, or certifi-12 cates of indebtedness issued under the provisions of this Act, 13 under such regulations as may be made in the discretion of the 14 Governor, Comptroller of the Treasury and Treasurer of the 15 State, constituting the Board of Public Works, or a majority 16

17of them; and the accrued interest between the date of the bonds or certificates of indebtedness and the time of sale and delivery 18 19or any payment for said bonds or certificates of indebtedness  $\mathbf{20}$ shall be adjusted with the purchaser thereof under such regulations as may be made in the discretion of the Governor,  $\mathbf{21}$ Comptroller of the Treasury and Treasurer of the State, con-22stituting the Board of Public Works, or a majority of them; 23 $\mathbf{24}$ and upon the day mentioned in said advertisement as the day for opening the bids for the proposals thereby called for they 25shall receive such scaled proposals for the purchase of as many  $\mathbf{26}$ of such bonds or certificates of indebtedness as may be men-27tioned or designated in said advertisement; and on the opening  $\mathbf{28}$ of such sealed proposals as many of said bonds or certificates 29of indebtedness as have been so bid for shall be awarded by 30the Governor, Comptroller of the Treasury and Treasurer of 31 the State, constituting the Board of Public Works, or a 3233 majority of them, to the highest responsible bidder or bidders therefor for cash, if the prices bid are adequate in the judg- $\mathbf{34}$ 35ment of the Governor, Comptroller of the Treasury and Treasurer, or a majority of them, and when two or more bidders 36 have made the same bid, and such bid is the highest and the 3738 certificates so bid for by the highest responsible bidders are in excess of the whole amount of certificates so offered for sale, 39such bonds or certificates of indebtedness shall be awarded to 40such highest responsible bidders, bidding the same price in 41 ratable proportion; and if any insufficient price be bid for 42a them they may be subsequently disposed of under the direction  $\mathbf{43}$ of the Governor, Comptroller of the Treasury and Treasurer 44 of the State, constituting the Board of Public Works, or a  $\mathbf{45}$ majority of them, at a private sale upon the best terms they 46can obtain for the same; provided they shall not be sold at 47private sale for less than par and accrued interest.  $\mathbf{48}$ 

1 SEC. 5. And be it further enacted, That the sum of five 2 thousand dollars (\$5,000.00) or so much thereof as may be 3 necessary shall be paid by the Treasurer of this State upon the 4 warrant of the Comptroller of the Treasury out of the pro-5 ceeds of the sale of bonds or certificates of indebtedness for the

6 payment of the expense of engraving, printing and other out7 lays connected with the issue of the loan hereby authorized, and
8 for the payment of the advertising directed by this Act, and all
9 other incidental expenses connected with the execution of its
10 provisions in connection with said loan.

1 SEC. 6. And be it further enacted, That the actual cash 2 proceeds of sale of the Certificates of Indebtedness to be issued 3 under this Act shall be used exclusively for the following pur-4 poses, to wit: The Comptroller of the Treasury of the State  $\mathbf{5}$ shall immediately upon the sale of and payment for said bonds 6 or certificates of indebtedness first return to and credit the Treasury with whatever advances of payments may have been  $\overline{7}$ made as provided by Section 5 of this Act. The remainder 8 9of the proceeds of said loan shall thereupon be turned over 10 to the Treasurer of the State of Maryland, and by him be held and placed to the credit of the Maryland Tercentenary Com-11 12mission, subject only to the requisition of the Treasurer of 13 said Commission, countersigned by its chairman, from time to time, as and when the same shall become necessary for the 14 purposes of this Act, but before the Treasurer of the said 15Maryland Tercentenary Commission shall proceed to act-as 16 17such Treasurer, he shall give to the State of Maryland a bond for the faithful discharge of his duties under this Act, in such 18form and in such penalty as the Governor, the Comptroller of 19 the Treasury, and Treasurer of the State, constituting the 2021Board of Public Works, or a majority of them, shall require. 22The purposes for which said remainder of said fund may be withdrawn as aforesaid are as follows, viz: for and in con-23nection with selecting and procuring in the name of the State, 2425a suitable site at Cowes, Isle of Wight, England, and for designing, erection thereon and unveiling of a durable me- $\mathbf{26}$ morial of stone and/or bronze with appropriate inscription 27marking the place from whence the original settlers sailed in  $\mathbf{28}$ the "Ark" and the "Dove" for the Province of Maryland, 29November 22nd, 1633; and for and in connection with the 30 31 selection and procuring in the name of the State a suitable site on Saint Clement's (now Blackiston's) Island, in the 32Potomac River, Maryland, and for the designing, crection 33

thereon, and unveiling of a durable and appropriate memorial 34 of stone and/or bronze or other suitable material with appro-35 priate inscription marking the place where the original settlers 36 first made their temporary landing in Maryland on or about 37 March 25th, 1634, and for and in connection with the selec-38 tion and procuring in the name of the State, a suitable site at 39 Saint Mary's City, Maryland, and for the designing, erection 40 thereon and unveiling of a durable and appropriate memorial 41 of stone and/or bronze or other suitable material, with ap-42 43 propriate inscription thereon marking the traditional place at Saint Mary's City where the first settlers landed from the 44 "Ark" and the "Dove," March 27th, 1634, and made their 45 first permanent settlement, said memorial shall be erected on 46 said site within the area containing nearly three acres, and 47 recently donated to the State for said purpose, and to be laid  $\mathbf{48}$ out and maintained by the State as and for a public park 49 surrounding said memorial; and for designing, laying out, 50and grading said area lying between the western line of the 51Church law and Cemetery on the east, and the low water line 52of Saint Mary's River on the southwest and the north (the 53 same being known as Church Point), as a public park, with 54shrubbery, trees and flowers, and with such breakwaters, lakes, 55drains, water courses, roads or walks and steps as will afford 5657 good and convenient ways through said park, and approach to said memorial, and to the Leonard Calvert Monument, in 58 or near said Cemetery, and the granite markers indicating the 5960 site of the first Capitol of Maryland, heretofore erected by the State; and for the acquisition, by purchase, condemnation 61or otherwise of the lot of ground heretofore tendered to the 62 63 State located on College Avenue, in the City of Annapolis, adjacent to the United States Post Office, or in their discre-64 tion, to select and acquire in the name of the State a site else-65 66 where, in the vicinity of other public buildings, in Annapolis. (to be approved by said Board of Public Works or a majority 67 68 of them) of adequate dimensions and suitable location and for 69 the designing, erection thereon and dedication of a durable 70 modern fireproof building to be known as the "Memorial Hall of Records" or by such other name as said Maryland Ter-71

centenary Commission may select, in which shall be gathered, 72 placed and preserved all ancient and private records of the 73 Province and State of Maryland from the beginning of the 74 Province to the adoption of the Federal Constitution, together 75with such others of a like character, which the City of Balti-76 more and the several counties of the State, and private indi-77 viduals may desire or be willing to deposit in said building, 78 and to provide and supply said building with the best equip-79 ment of desks, tables, filing cases, chairs, shelves and stacks, 80 and other furniture and facilities necessary for and adapted 81 to said purpose for the use of custodians, clerks, and all per-82 sons desiring to examine and use such records, and for the 83 repair, preservation, handling and safekeeping of the same, 84 the said building, in addition to the special purposes herein-85 before set forth, to be used for such other purposes, as the 86 Board of Public Works may determine not in conflict with 87 the purposes hereinbefore mentioned; and as incidental to said 88 commemoration, and in the discretion of said Commission, to 89 purchase eight thousand (8,000) copies of a special edition of 90 a historical picture map of Maryland in five colors (about 27 91 inches by 40 inches in dimensions) drawn by Edwin L. Tunis, 92 93 Artist, and prepared, edited and published by the Enoch Pratt Free Library, and bearing the imprint of the Maryland Ter-94 centenary Commission, showing by pictures and descriptive 95 language many points of historical interest within the State; 96 said special edition to be delivered by said publishers to such 97 proper officials of the schools, colleges, and institutions in the 98 State of Maryland for distribution among them, as the Mary-99 land Tercentenary Commission, in its discretion, may desig-100 nate; and in the discretion of the Commission to have pre-101 102 pared for exhibition a series of motion pictures of historical scenes, places and events pertaining to and illustrative of the 103 life in the Province and State of Maryland from its founding 104 105 to the present time; and for the expense of celebrations in 106 other places, in the State, and for a survey of the historical resources of the State, compensation of executive officers and 107 108 other employees of the Maryland Tercentenary Commission.

and for advertising and general publicity and all other proper
and necessary expenditures incident to carrying out of the
objects and purposes of this Act. Provided, however, that no
member of said Commission shall be paid any salary or other
compensation without the approval of the Governor.

SEC. 7. And be it further enacted, That if said Commission 1 cannot from any cause agree with the owner or owners of land  $\mathbf{2}$ 3 they may deem necessary and proper for the site upon which to erect said Memorial Hall of Records, as to the price to be 4 paid for the same, when and if an appropriation is hereafter 5 made therefor, then the said Commission is hereby authorized 6 to proceed to condemn in the name of the State the said land 7 in manner as provided by the Code of Public General Laws 8 of the State of Maryland, Article 23, title "Corporations," and 9 all rights, powers and privileges conferred by said Article upon 10 the corporations therein mentioned relating to the condemna-11 tion of land is hereby expressly conferred and vested in said 12 Commission. And the Comptroller of the State is hereby au-13 thorized and directed to draw his warrant on the Treasurer 14 of the State for the payment of such requisitions to the extent 15 of this appropriation, as may from time to time be made upon 16 17 him by said Commission, said requisitions to be signed by the Treasurer of the Commission, and countersigned by its Chair-18 man, and shall be accompanied by the bill, or estimate of the 19 expenses and the purposes for which the money so drawn is to 20be applied, provided that said Treasurer shall be required by 21 said Commission to give bond to the State of Maryland in the 2223usual form of such bonds, with such surety, and in such penalty as the Commission may prescribe. 24

1 SEC. 8. And be it further enacted, That the Maryland Ter-2 centenary Commission is hereby authorized and directed to 3 ask for bids and enter into contracts in the usual form appli-4 cable to the work to be done, and the structures to be erected, 5 as it may from time to time under the provisions hereof deter-6 mine to construct, said contracts to be made in the name of the 7 Maryland Tercentenary Commission, and to contain the same

8 provisions now required by law and the nature of said struc-9 tures.

SEC. 9. And be it further enacted. That on the completion 1 2 of said memorials at Saint Clement's Island and Saint Mary's 3 City, the Governor shall appoint to serve until the expiration of his term of office (and thereafter his successors shall appoint 4 every four years), a Commission to be known as "Maryland  $\mathbf{5}$ 6 Tercentenary Memorial Commission" to serve without pay and to be composed of not more than five citizens of the State of 7 8 Marvland, in the discretion of the Governor, at least one of 9 whom shall be a resident of Saint Mary's County, whose duty it shall be to see that said memorial and site on St. Clement's 10 Island, and the memorial proposed to be erected at Saint 11 Mary's City, and the said area of ground or park in which the 12 13 same is to be erected and also the Leonard Calvert monument heretofore erected there, and the site of the old Capitol and its 14 markers, shall be kept in good order, and appearance, the 15 16reasonable cost thereof to be approved by the Governor not exceeding twelve hundred dollars (\$1,200.00) per annum, to 17 be borne by the State of Maryland, and to be provided for in 18 the annual budget, and shall be drawn on the requisition of the 19 20Treasurer of that Commission, countersigned by the Chairman thereof, and said Commission shall make a detailed report at 2122least annually to the Governor of their expenses supported by vouchers, and of the condition and appearance of said memo-23rials and sites, which they shall personally inspect at least 24 twice a year. 25

SEC. 10. And be it further enacted, That if after securing 1 2 all the sites, and the completion of said park, and of the memo-3 rials and structures in this Act mentioned and the payment of the costs of the same, and of all the outlays and expenses 4 incident to said commemoration provided for in this Act, there 5 should be any surplus remaining unused to the credit of said 6 Maryland Tercentenary Commission, or in the hands of the 7 Treasurer of the State of Maryland, out of the total proceeds 8 of sales of said bonds, or certificates of indebtedness, said sur-9 plus shall be turned back into the general funds of the State 10

of Maryland; and should there be any premium from the proceeds of sale or sales of said bonds or certificates of indebtedness, that likewise shall be turned back into the general funds
of the State of Maryland.

SEC. 11. And be it further enacted, That this Act shall take
 effect on June first, nineteen hundred and thirty-one.
