after much discussion it was moved and second that no. 20 would be given six months ~~trial~~ trial and see how loyal they would be.

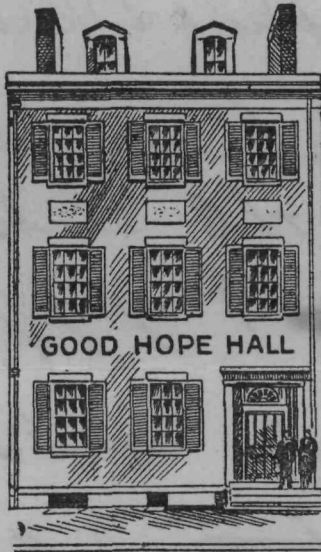
