The following Special Commission being produced
was Read to wit The State of Maryland to the Hon-
orable John Buchanan Chief Judge & the Honorable
Abraham Shriver and Thomas Buchanan Associate
Judges of the Fifth Judicial District Greeting —

Whereas it hath been represented to me that a certain
George Swearingen is now confined in the Jail of Alleg-
any County charged with the Murder of his wife Mary
L. Swearingen, and that the purpose of his trial will be
promoted by having the said George Swearingen brought to
trial upon the said charge before the Regular Term of
the County Court of said County which cannot be done
without a Special Commission for that purpose. Now There-
fore Know Ye that I have appointed and do hereby Com-
mission You the said John Buchanan Abraham Shriver
and

and Thomas Buchanan Cheif and associate Judges
as aforesaid County or any one or more of you to hear &
determine all Crimes offences or Misdemeanors whatsoever
ever that have Arisen or may Arise in Allegany County
and ^{to} deliver the Gaol of the said County from all persons
confined therein charged with any Crime offence or mis-
demeanor, and therefore in Virtue of the powers vested in
me by the law, I hereby command you and each of you
that on Monday the third day of August next, you or any
one or More of you attend at Cumberland in the said
County of Allegany to deliver the Gaol as will of the pris-
oner aforesaid as of any other prisoners that may be conf-
ined therein charged with any Crime offence or Misdem-
eanor doing thereby what to Justice appertains according
to the Laws of the State and adjourning the said Court from
day to day as may be necessary, and I hereby command
the Sheriff of the County that on the said day or any oth-
er day you may adjourn to be cause before ^{arrested} you, the
said Prisoner and his Commitment as all other prisoners
and their Commitments. Given under my hand and the

of Allegany County Greeting. You are hereby Commanded
to cause to come before a Special Court of Oyer and
Termination for Allegany County, to be held in Cumberland
the third day of August eighteen hundred and twenty nine
forty eight the good and lawful men of the best and most
understanding of the Body of your County, to serve as Jurors
of the said County by whom the truth of the several Mat-
ters depending before the same Court may be the better

before his eyes but being Moved and Seduced by the Intrig
ation of the Devil on the eighth day of September in the

with force and arms at the County aforesaid in and upon the
Mary C Swearingan late the wife of him the said George
Swearingan in the peace of God and the State of Maryland
then and there being feloniously wilfully and of his malice
aforethought did make an assault and that the said Geo
=ge Swearingan with a certain Hickory Club which he
the said George Swearingan in his right hand then there
had and held the said Mary C Swearingan in & upon
the fore head and nearly between the eye brows of her the said
Mary C Swearingan then and there feloniously wilfully
and of his malice aforesaid thought did strike and brace, and
that the said George Swearingan with a certain Stone
which he the said George Swearingan in both his hands then

The said Mary C Swearengan intimated upon the right side of the head near
the right temple of her own self said George Swearengan feloniously
and then had and held the said George Swearengan feloniously
wilfully and of his malice aforethought did strike
bruise and wound and her the said Mary C Swearengan
then and there by such said strokes bruise and wounds there
and then feloniously and of his malice aforethought did
knock them cast and throw to the ground and whilst
the said Mary C Swearengan was so lying upon the
ground the said George Swearengan then and there with
both the hands of him the said George Swearengan the
mouth and nostrils of her the said Mary C Swearengan
feloniously wilfully and of his malice aforethought did
fasten and tight close and her the said Mary C Swear-
engan then and there by such fastening and by closing the
mouth and nostrils of her the said Mary C Swearengan fel-
oniously wilfully and of his malice aforethought did suff-
ocate and strangle by means of which said strokes bruise
and wound and also of such knocking throwing casting
and throwing to the ground and by means of which said fast-
ening and tight closing the mouth and nostrils after the said
Mary C Swearengan and of such said suffocation & stran-
gling she the said Mary C Swearengan then and there did
instantly die and so the jurors aforesaid upon their oaths
aforesaid do say that the said George Swearengan her the
said Mary C Swearengan in manner and form and by
the means aforesaid feloniously wilfully wickedly & cruelly
of his malice aforethought did kill and murder contrary
to the form of the act of Assembly in such case made & provided
and against the peace Government & Dignity of the said State

And the Jurors aforesaid upon their oaths aforesaid do further present that the said George Swearingan late of the said County Esquire afterwards to wit on the day and year aforesaid with force and arms at the County aforesaid upon the said Mary C. Swearingan late the wife of him the said George Swearingan in the peace of God and the State of Maryland then and there being feloniously wilfully and of his malice aforethought did make an assault and that the said George Swearingan with a certain club which he the said George Swearingan in his right hand then and there held & held the said Mary C. Swearingan in and upon the forehead and nearly between the eye brows of her the said Mary C. Swearingan then and there feloniously wilfully and of his malice aforethought did strike and bruise thereby then and there giving unto the said Mary C. Swearingan in and upon the forehead ^{highly between eye brows of her the said} one mortal bruise and ^{of which said mortal bruise and contusion} contusion, the the said Mary C. Swearingan then and there instantly died, and so the Jurors aforesaid upon their oaths aforesaid do say that the said George Swearingan the said Maryland C. Swearingan in manner and form last aforesaid feloniously wilfully and of his malice aforethought did kill and murder contrary to the form of the act of Assembly in such case made and provided and against the peace Government and dignity of the said State —

And the Jurors aforesaid upon their oaths aforesaid do further present that the said George Swearingan late of the said County Esquire afterwards to wit on the day and year aforesaid at the County aforesaid with force and arms at the County aforesaid in and upon the said Mary C. Swearingan late the wife of him

The said George Swearingan in the peace of God and the State
of Maryland then and there being feloniously wilfully and of
his malice aforethought did make an assault and that he
the said George Swearingan with a certain Stone which
he the said George Swearingan in his right hand then and
then had and held the said Mary C Swearingan in upon
the right side of the head on the right temple of her the
said Mary C Swearingan then and there feloniously wil-
fully and of his malice aforethought did strike bruse and
wounds giving to the said Mary C Swearingan then & there
with the Stone aforesaid in and upon the right temple of
her the said Mary C Swearingan one mortal wound
and contusion of the Brain of four inches and of the

hath or knoweth anything to say wherefore the said Court
here ought not upon the premises and Verdict aforesaid

and thereupon the said George Swearingan is committed
to the Sheriff of the County aforesaid and the Court is
adjourned untile Monday Morning at 9 o'clock -
Monday Morning at nine o'clock the Court met present
as on Saturday The prisoner George Swearingan was
set to the Bar and whereupon all and singular the
premises being seen and by the Court here fully under
(Seal)

understood it is thereupon considered by the Court here
that the said George Swearingan be taken to the jail of
the County of Allegany from whence he came and from
thence to the place of Execution at such time as shall be
duly appointed and that he be there hanged by the neck
untill he be dead, and that the said Sheriff see the Execu-
tion of this Judgment and thereupon he is committed to
the custody of the Sheriff aforesaid and soforth —
